- 1. PROGRAMME OUTCOME NAME OF THE DEPARTMENT: BENGALI
- The sincere student achieves a strong foothold on the language discipline of Bengali and its rich literature that has evolved over time and through the ages. History of the Bengali Language from its origin to twentieth century with special emphasis helps to understand the stages of evolution and literature of that phase simultaneously.
- Study of Linguistics will help students the Bengali language-including sounds, words, sentences and meaning. Students will understand Bengali language in an historical context and they will learn how Bengali language changed over time and how it varies from situation to situation and place to place. Study of Linguistics will also help in making the foundation of language stronger and will improve the practical and intellectual skills.
- Fiction and novel, structural pattern and craft: Deep research into a broader cultural praxis, myth of telling a story and how it is narrated from the other's point of view, new experiments in plot, character and methodology.
- A comprehensive and detailed analysis of the history of social or cultural, political or the primitive mythological deep rooted systems helps students to acquire a true understanding of evolution of the Bengali culture through various perspectives.
- Insights into the Post-war transformations of the different art forms, structural denominations of past legacy and history of social, political and cultural dilemma weaving around colonial India
- A Comprehensive introspection of various genres and structural analysis.

- Study of the twentieth century classics with respect to structuralism, semiotics, grammatology and narrative ideas, epistemological features and feminist approaches. Socio- political impact of 19th and 20th century prose, colonial influence, religious and social identities; Significant aspects of national uprising, class struggle, new methodological inputs and transient traditions: a detailed and structured metamorphosis.
- Advanced techniques in the craft of fiction, short story and experiments in the 20th century novel, historical novel, epic novel and stream of consciousness novel.
- A detailed knowledge of the twentieth century poetry, trends and intentions from Rabindranath to the later modern poets
- Analytical observations of Drama, symbolist tendencies, the changing means of communication in satire, wit and contemporary individual voices of protest, theme and history of new experiments
- Extended knowledge background with respect to the growth and development of IPA and experimental methods for upcoming new genres.
- Protests and revolt against Fascism and Capitalism, protests and strike against landlords or rich industrialists by farmers and labourers contributed to a new phase of literary documentation.
- The Fort William College and the Vernacular Literature Society: their contribution to growth of Bengali prose, essays, translations of mythology and old religious texts of Sanskrit.

Discipline Specific Courses (DSE)

- Will develop the backdrop of folk tales and structural analysis of oral discourse and the literature for children and adolescents: form and stylistics which qualify new tendencies of society and culture.
- Study of different forms of linguistic and semantic manifestations ensure a deep reading of science fiction, mystery novels and popular literature which helps to achieve a critical understanding of the growth of individual protest and literary activism.
- The course is built suitably to help students acquire a solid basis of comparative understanding of concepts of classical authors and thinkers.

Program Specific Outcomes of Bengali Honours

Specific outcomes of this course are identified by what students learn and apply. The Course imparts a deep and profound understanding about Bengali Language and Literature through the stages of evolution and transformation, in different perspectives, their valuable contribution to society, the influences they have drawn from historical experiences and their evolution into an Indian and International language in its modern and more functional form. The prospects of the undergraduate program in Bengali Honours is spelled out as follows —

- Higher studies in University of Calcutta or other reputed Universities.
- Studies in the filled of Advertising, Media, Journalism, Print Media and Publishing Houses and opportunities for employment in these areas.
- Suitable job orientation as junior research associate, in college libraries and universities.
- Eligibility through School Service Commission Examinations and other sources as teaching faculty in schools at the Primary, Secondary and Higher Secondary levels.
- Scope of social, community and rural engagement through involvement with government institutions and NGOs.

Course Outcomes of Bengali Generic (Elective) Course

Through this curriculum students learn to translate English to Bengali and contrarily from Bengali to English. Moreover, they acquire skills in proofreading, formal letter-writing, reporting or various affairs etc. Exercise of all these methods will help students in getting jobs as translator, professional Proof-reader or Reporter in News agencies and thus the course of study is building proficiency required for getting employed in different streams in hardcore publishing or advertising areas.

2. PROGRAMME OUTCOME NAME OF THE DEPARTMENT: ECONOMICS

- The programme provides a basic understanding of the fundamental problems of an economy and the optimal allocation of resources to meet the needs of society.
- 2. The students will learn the market clearing mechanism for setting up equilibrium prices and quantity depending on the demand and supply structures from aggregate to disaggregate unit level.
- 3. The students will learn how various economic agents such as, consumers; firms, etc. behave rationally to optimize their goals given the economic resources
- 4. The programme will help to impart knowledge regarding nature, construction, and measurement of key macroeconomic variables.
- 5. Understand the measurement of different components of national income and its importance as an indicator of human wellbeing.
- 6. Gets an idea regarding the determination of income in the short run and long run with essential impacts of fiscal and monetary policy variables in different macroeconomic sets (Classical and Simple Keynesian and Complete Keynesian).
- 7. Understand the basic demographic concepts and their evolution during the process of development along with various theories and model explaining the problems of a labour surplus economy
- 8. Learn different measures of poverty and inequality and explore the connection between growth and inequality.

3. PROGRAMME OUTCOME NAME OF THE DEPARTMENT: EDUCATION

Programme Outcome (POs): The students are awarded BA with Education Honours degree after successful Completion of three years/six semesters of study. Within these semesters they have to undergo a total of 18 papers (Only for Honours-CC & DSE) of 75 marks each having various categories of courses. There are 14(fourteen) papers in the subject Education throughout the semesters leveled as core courses. There are 4(four) more papers named as Discipline Specific Electives (DSE). So, all total 18 papers of 75 marks are taught in the Honours subject throughout six semesters.

The students after obtaining B.A with Education Honours degree become eligible for higher studies in Education and also for employment in various jobs especially the subject matter of education helps the students to attain the following outcomes.

- 1. **Knowledge:** Study of Education as a subject enhances the basic knowledge of philosophy, sociology, psychology, Research, Technology. Management, Guidance and Counselling as well as the various ideas concepts and components of education as a discipline.
- Understanding: The subject matter of education helps the students to comprehend the real meaning of education and its important in human life. It also develops the understanding of life, aims of life and the various ways of achieving those aims.
- 3. **Application:** Studying Education as a subject develops the ability of an individual to apply or use the acquired knowledge and experiences in the changing individual, social and professional or vocational life situations.
- 4. Social Skills and Competencies: Education as a subject enables the individuals to acquire various personal and social skills which are essential in day to day living. It inculcates the moral, ethical and aesthetic values, social and national responsibilities.
- 5. **Development of proper attitude:** Studying education as a subject helps to develop proper attitude towards life, society and nation. It also develops the sense of responsibilities of individuals as human beings.
- 6. **Employability**: Studying the subject Education makes the individual eligible to get a job. Besides that, the knowledge and understanding of education develop good attitude, accountability and adaptability of an individual towards job or profession.

The course curriculum inculcates among students a basic understanding of the rights and duties of citizenship and thereby to act as responsible citizens through the observation of important days such as independence day, constitution day, national voter's day and also spreading awareness in society through regular conversations on specific socio political issues such as domestic violence, gender inequality etc. the program helps the student to become informed, aware and responsible citizens.

PO2- ENHANCED COMMUNICATION SKILLS:

By building linkages between academics and civil society at large the program tries to familiarize the students with pertinent socio-political issues. the fortnightly wall journal is a means for keeping the entire student population up to date with political occurrences both global and domestic. debates, seminars and panel discussions are also regularly organised on relevant themes to help the students to structure their thoughts and opinions and express their ideas with others. Such interactive sessions provide them further opportunities to sharpen their oratory skills, coordinate their reasoning and debating proficiency and enhance their communication skills.

PO3 - POLITICAL SCIENCE AND SOCIETY:

This program increases the understanding the inter relationship between policy decisions and its effects on society. This is achieved through a comprehensive teaching of the practice of public administration, public policy and governance in India.

PO4- CRITICAL THINKING:

The ability to analyse and predict socio political phenomena based on the study of existing socio- economic determinants and past experiences. The courses are not only structured to impart received knowledge but also encourage the student to think critically and raise questions which can contribute to a new understanding and explanation.

PO5- INDIVIDUAL AND TEAM WORK:

This program trains the students to function effectively as an individual and as a member/leader in different social settings. This aim is achieved through team research and presentations, especially inter college student seminars, debate and extempore competitions, by participating in the youth parliament competition organised by the department of parliamentary affairs, government of West Bengal.

PO 6- INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH:

The discipline aims to provide students with both a conceptual and a practical grasp of the discipline, and to encourage them to draw connections between Political Science and other social science disciplines by offering courses of an inter-disciplinary nature. The curriculum aims to make the student proficient in Political Science as well as in certain inter-disciplinary areas, through the transfer of knowledge in the classroom, and practical knowledge obtained through practical interactions and field experiences.

The courses offered by the programme are designed to equip the student with a robust foundation in Political Science. The SkillEnhancement Courses acquaint the student with the applied aspects of this fascinating discipline, allowing him or her to use the skills learnt to face problems and challenges that arise in the real world.

12.PROGRAMME OUTCOME NAME OF THE DEPARTMENT: SANSKRIT

- The undergraduate course in Sanskrit (Honours) has been designed in a way so that the students can learn a variety of traditional disciplines in Sanskrit studies and they can strengthen their knowledge of the language.
- After successfully completing the course the students will obtain a clear vision about Vedic studies, the huge volume of literature like – prose, poetry and drama literary criticism; vyakarana which covers a large area of linguistics; darshana i.e. philosophy and logic; dharma Shastra which covers many areas of sociology and legal studies.
- The Honours course will especially focus on issues which have a contemporary resonance.

- * Since the programme also offers a wide range of elective courses (Discipline specific electives) to the students, skills learnt during the entire course will immensely help the students to pursue their post graduate studies and undertake further research in these disciplines.

13.PROGRAMME OUTCOME NAME OF THE DEPARTMENT: SOCIOLOGY

- 1. The primary objective of the UG programme in Sociology is to acquaint the students with the nature, trends and dynamics of society and social life. The programme with its emphasis on the theoretical understanding of society intends to develop the analytical skills of the students, hence motivating them to become active agents of social change through social engineering. With a rigorous training
- 2. in sociological methodologies the students can understand people more fully with all the diversities. This includes a thorough comprehension of the diverse nature of social relationships, social institutions, social structures, communities and groups in which people find themselves in the social setting. Focusing on these, the programme attempts to widen the horizon of the students' sociological imagination to develop a distinct sociological perspective. Besides, the programme sensitizes the students towards the diverse nature of social inequalities causing various micro and macro level social problems with an aim to provide feasible solutions to these. A proper training in the different aspects of sociological research methods, quantitative as well as qualitative, and other appropriate techniques might prove instrumental here. Considering that sociological knowledge is empowering, the programme, in more general terms, attempts to sharpen the analytical and critical capabilities of the students in order to ensure them a harmonious, meaningful and productive social life.

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
