

ABOUT THE COLLEGE



t is twenty-four years since our Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya began its humble journey and indeed in all these years it has carefully built brick by brick an edifice of education and has been nurturing students with purpose and passion and paving the path for opportunities and success. Starting as an affiliated college under the University of Calcutta in 2000, the affiliation of the college was switched to West Bengal State University at Barasat since 2008 like all the other 57 colleges of the district. Now the College has a partial three-storied building comprising of 22 classrooms at present and three specific rooms/computer labs have been allotted to the departments of Geography, Music and Journalism & Mass Communication.

The College besides having a virtual classroom, has ICT enable classroom. The fully automated college library with its spacious reading room provides the students a wide array of books and materials that facilitates the learning process coupled with internet connectivity. It has an air-conditioned stack room for better upkeep of books and periodicals. Now, the student strength of the college is around two thousand. The teaching-learning-evaluation infrastructure and ambience of the college are conducive to academic upliftment. It has struck an exemplary chord among the neighboring schools and colleges. The results of university examinations over the years speak of our achievement despite having a serious shortage of funds, manpower, and infrastructure. Over the years the reputation of the college has spread far and wide and it has consistently attracted students from distant areas and diverse strata of the society who routinely vie for admission each year to become a part of this august institution.

Presently the college offers 4 YEAR Major courses in ten subjects in B.A. and B.Sc.: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Journalism and Mass Comm, Sociology, Music, Sanskrit, and Education. There are thirteen (13) Minor subjects available in B.A. and B.Sc: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Sociology, Education, Physical Education, Economics, Sanskrit, Music, Journalism and Mass Communication and Mathematics. A computer course (as a SEC Course) has been initiated under the supervision of NIELIT from the 2016-17 session at a reasonable cost.

The college now has a decent Students' Union building outside the main building of the college within the campus along with a boys' and a girls' common rooms. The college canteen is housed in the recent building. The canteen provides a variety of food items at a reasonable price to the staff and students.

The motto of the college has unflaggingly remained to impart the best with the least means. The college was accorded 2(f) and 12B status by the UGC in October 2011.

There is no denying that the college is heading for excellence. Now it also has a Minority Cell, Career Counseling Cell, Research Committee, RTI Section and Internal Complaints Committee. The NSS Unit of the college is working hard and reaching out to the neighbouring community of people. The college is linked with the Students' Health Home that caters to the medical needs of the students. As a part of the Social Outreach Programme various beneficial activities have been carried out at Gilapole by our college.

Since the institution's inception, the students of the college have made their marks in the fields of games and sports. Their achievements are lauded with trophies and awards in various fields and they have successfully participated and contributed to national events representing the university. The students from the Department of Music have also gained tremendous achievements by participating in various college and university level competitions. Students from this department have also become university toppers.


The college library is steadily being upgraded on all fronts with infrastructural developments -- books, journals, magazines, and e-resources. Presently the number of books in the college library stands at around 12,000 along with institutional subscriptions to 5 hard copy leading journals and many more online journals. The library provides computer facilities along with reading room facilities to staff and students. Apart from the central library there are departmental libraries of the Core subjects which though small still cater to the specific needs of the faculties and students of the respective subjects.

The college Governing Body was formed in 2008 and has been providing adequate guidance in the functioning of the college. The Students' Council is also quite cooperative and lends effective support in conducting all academic and administrative matters concerning students.

Since the 2014-15 academic session, the college has adopted online admission system which has enormously saved time and given opportunity to avoid hazards of the otherwise cumbersome process. Since 2015-16 sessions, in colleges all over West Bengal, this system has been introduced by an order of the Higher Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal.

The college received a donation of Rs.10000/-from the eldest son of late Dr. Sadhan Sen to allot-award/prizes to two best students of the final year—one from Honours and the other from General course. The annual award ceremony is organised in the month of January every year to celebrate the achievements of our students. In this ceremony all subject toppers are also awarded.

On a positive note, the future of the college holds the promise of excellence by moving ahead with the prospect of introducing new courses, both in B.A. and B.Sc. The 4 YEAR UG PROGRAM under NEP has rolled out from the 2023-24 session to facilitate greater flexibility in the choice of subjects the college can offer to the enrolled students. We look forward to marching towards academic excellence in coming days. For this to happen all concerned – students, staff, faculty and management–will have to work hard in a disciplined manner.





VISION:

Since the beginning, the mission of the college has been to inculcate collegiate (degree level) education among the economically challenged and minority community students of neighbouring areas from where students throng to get admitted into this college. This vision demands the introduction of modern subjects, job-oriented courses commensurate with the needs of the day and the conventional subjects of study. 
INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

ADMISSION PROCESS

The West Bengal Higher Education department has decided to put in place a centralized portal for online admission to undergraduate degree courses in state-run and state-aided colleges and universities.

As part of the new system, a student can apply to any state aided institution through a central portal rather than logging into the admission portal of a particular institution.

Details of admission process through the central portal will be given in the college website www.nsmashoknagar. ac.in. Admission to 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters is done by the college authority.

CHANGE OF STREAM AND SUBJECTS:

Candidates are advised to be extremely cautious while selecting streams, subjects, etc. before taking admission. Prayer for change of subject may be permitted as per WBSU guidelines.

COLLEGE EXAMINATION:

The college conducts internal examination in Core/General Subjects. Apart from this examination, the students are advised to sit for class tests when conducted by a teacher. The practical examination for the science stream (General) is taken based on continuous evaluation in the practical classes. Attendance is mandatory in the practical classes. The percentage of presence of the students is also allotted a considerable share of the total marks. Long absence may result in loss of marks. Absence in any of these examinations/ tests will be considered a break of the academic discipline of the college and is to be seriously dealt with.




At the book fair held at the camus in January, 2024, nsm FILM CLUB showed a few documentaries including a documentary on writer Buddhadeb Guha.

LIBRARY FACILITIES

The Central Library has access to online resources via Nlist which is an initiative of Ministry of Human Resource Development under National Mission on Education through ICT to extend e-resources to colleges in India. Our students and faculty members have been using this online resource containing over 600 e-journals and 2,00,000 e-books. Photocopying and printing facilities are also available at a subsidized rate for our students and teachers. A story book section is also available at the reading room for the readers who wish to spend some time reading some literary stuff between classes.





STUDENT MENTORING: BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN THE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS.



The mentoring system is one of the best practices of our college. The pandemic and continuing lockdown took a toll on the mental health of the students who needed a moral boost up along with necessary information and advice regarding their institutional education and career. The mentors carried out this responsibility with utmost sincerity and empathy and were thoroughly connected to their mentees mainly through phone calls and online platforms. However, they also counselled in person once the educational institutions were reopened albeit for a brief period in November, 2021. This ascertained better attendance, interaction and helped to curb the percentage of drop-outs. Our college facilitated a vaccination drive organised by the WB Government

where the mentors, vigilant regarding their mentees' well-being, played a vital role in reaching out to them and ensured vaccination of the students as far as possible.

Exhibition

Department of History organized an exhibition of this college on 09/01/24. The theme of the exhibition was Ashoknagar. The aim of the exhibition was to motivate our students to know about their own local history. They collected information on various aspects of Ashoknagar and it's historical legacy. With photos and information they organized a beautiful exhibition which were praised by students and teachers.

The Department of Education organized an Exhibition cum Wall Magazine on April 16, 2024, with the theme "Cultural Diversity in India." The exhibition aimed to motivate students to learn about India's rich cultural heritage. Both current students and alumni contributed to the beautifully arranged exhibition, which received high praise from the teachers for its beauty and educational value.







FEES CONCESSION

The college took the initiative to provide concession to the students across all semesters amidst the financial difficulties due to the imposition of the lockdown. The college reduced fee amount on various heads such as admission, tuition, development, computer fees, practical, sports, college app & LMS, student aid for admission to 1st semester course provision of special concession above the general concession was provided to students who applied for it through their mentors or student council and was thereby verified to give the maximum benefit to the most disadvantaged and needy of all. In general, the college authority provides fee concession to meritorious students as well as to good sports persons enrolled in our college.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

The college provides services by facilitating the applications of students for various government scholarships like Kanyashree Prakalpya, Swami Vivekananda Scholarship, Aikashree Prakalpa and many others. The college office staff and the student welfare and minority committee members worked diligently to provide the students with the necessary information, distributing forms, verification of the submitted applications help the students in every possible way.

SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMS

NSS & EXTENSION COMMITTEE

The NSS unit of the college has been actively working to instill the spirit of community service and social responsibility. STUDENT CENTRIC E-LEARNING: LMS (LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM)

SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS

COMPUTER TRAINING COURSE

From 2016-17, the "Basic Computer Course" is off use to 3rd semester students irrespective of streams at a very nominal cost. For this purpose, the institution has decided to upgrade the infrastructural facilities by providing access to computers and free Wi-Fi connectivity to all students within the campus.

VOCATIONAL COURSE

From the academic session 2021-22, our college, in collaboration with Webel, has introduced a mobile repairing course spanning 3 months for the students with an aim to enhance their vocational skills which would help them to secure employment or even start a business venture of their own while studying and thus provide for themselves and their families.




EDUCATIONAL TOUR

Together with the usual class-room teaching and outdoor practical classes, educational tours with the students of the departments are arranged to different places of educational and historical importance. In this academic session, several Honours departments separately organized such tours and created exciting opportunity for our students to experience art and culture first hand and appreciate things in a much deeper level than they ever could in the classroom.















STUDENT MENTORING

The institution has developed a strong mentoring system to deal with its students' academic and personal problems in a more efficacious way. The mentors, besides monitoring and counseling these students, continuously intensify their efforts to motivate them in their academic pursuits. With careful discernment, they help them to set their goals too by making them realize their potentiality and by enhancing their practical knowledge, skills and building proper social and cultural etiquette in the primary stage of their career. This system not only helps to bridge the gap between students and teachers but it also closely links the institution with its alumni. The mentors as adviser, friend, guide and recourse person leave an impression on mentees and positively influence their academic, professional, social and ethical values and perspectives. The system also helps the students to achieve wider exposure, problem-solving skills and a broader and richer social life.

Each mentor is allocated the responsibility of a group of forty students. The mentors individually meet the students outside their class hours and collect information regarding their academic and personal life without touching sensitive areas or uncomfortable issues and then these data along with their names and contact numbers are properly documented to track and nurture their overall growth.

FACILITATING SCHOLARSHIPS

The college office provides application forms of "Kanyashree Prakalpa" (a conditional cash transfer scheme under the Department of Women Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal) and has the aim of improving the status and well-being of the girl child in West Bengal by innervating schooling of teenage girls. Apart from that, the college assists with two other state government-sponsored scholarships. One is the "Swami Vivekananda Scholarship", which is a meritcum-means based scholarship scheme for the meritorious and economically backward students and the other is "Aikyashree" which is for the meritorious students of the minority community. In this way, students can apply for all types of Govt. scholarships with the help of the college office staff and under the proper supervision of various committees of the college. In the academic session, 2022-23 a total number of 1334 students got government scholarships amounting to Rs. 1,21,24,040.

FEES CONCESSION

Concession in fees and free studentship may be granted but on the basis of merit cum means under the existing rules. Defaulters in stipulated attendance will not be entertained for such concession. Students praying for the concession of fees in tuition fees must submit their applications with supporting documents in prescribed format within the notified date. In this regard, students are called for an interview before the Concession Sub- Committee.

STUDENT-CENTRIC IMPORTANT COMMITTEES & CELLS

There are different committees to address student problems and raise awareness

CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

The cell has been established to counsel and guide our students in relation to the career opportunities in their respective areas. While our teachers help out by offering information and other related data on a regular basis,

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

The college has constituted Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) as per the UGC guidelines to receive and redress complaints on sextual harassment at workplace.

MINORITY CELL

Following the UGC regulations, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya has set up a cell for the minority students with representatives from the teachers and the non-teaching staff. The objectives of the cell are to look into the general welfare and progression of minority students. Like previous year, in this year also the cell organized webinar to make our students aware of different types of central and state scholarships.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The college administration along with the students' council has put in place an Anti-Ragging Committee for building and preserving a culture of Ragging-Free Environment on the campus. The functions of Anti-Ragging committee is to keep a strict vigil, prevent the incidences of ragging and most importantly to create awareness amongst the students about the ill effects of ragging. The committee also educates the students by adopting various means like exhibiting posters or holding programmes regarding the menace of ragging and the related punishments there to.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

In order to promote and maintain a conducive and harmonious educational environment among the students, the Grievance Redressal Cell of our college looks into the complaints lodged by the students. They can voice any kind of discontent or dissatisfaction regarding academic and non-academic matters in the college campus freely and frankly without any fear of victimization. Complaint Boxes are installed in the college campus in which they can drop their writings or they can register their compliance through mailing to the convenor of the cell. In this respect, mentors play a very vital role in showing the ways in which he/she can lodge complaint and ask for redressal and also giving moral support to their mentees. The cell addresses their grievances promptly with an impartial and fair approach.

NSS UNIT & EXTENSION PROGRAMME

The NSS unit plays a pivotal role to instill social responsibility in the students thereby preparing them for real life situations and facilitating a holistic development of the students. Various extension programmes stimulate students' awareness in various aspects of life such as health and well being, ecocentric living, patriotism, cleanliness etc. The students who are admitted as NSS volunteers do not stay confined within the college premises but visit the neighbouring localities to carry out various outreach programmes. Cleanliness, use of first aid, awareness to curb diseases such as Dengue, HIV AIDS, oral and cervical Cancer etc. are propagated to the local communities. Free health check-up camps and sanitation programmes in the adopted village are organised by the NSS unit of the college. Students also participate in Republic day parades and various government events such as distribution of Student Credit Cards etc.

He along with other members of the said committee distributed the blankets to the listed villagers. Most of the villagers of Gilapol village are tribal. In winter the poor villagers become very helpless. By distributing blankets our college took a small step to help them.









STUDENT HEALTH HOME

The college is an institutional member of Student Health Home located at Habra, a branch of the Central Students' Health Home in Kolkata. Each student of the college is entitled to health assistance from these centers for which he/she has to collect Health Home Card from the college office. A MOU has been signed with 'Matrisadan', a hospital run by the Municipality to ensure that students and staff of the college are provided with discounts in case of treatment.

PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

Our institution believes in creating a strong partnership between teachers and parents with the common goal of addressing the concerns and priorities of the students. Meetings with the parents are regularly held and a parent is always welcome to consult the teachers and the college authority if it is necessary. - Addressing the grievances and various other problems of the students.




NURTURING THE THINKING MIND

COLLEGE CANTEEN

A new building for the college canteen and student utility center has been made available to the students. The college canteen has separate eating arrangements for students and staff. Various types of good quality food
