Report of the Webinar on "Reconstructing India: The mission and visions of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose"

A one day state level webinar on "Reconstructing India: The mission and visions of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose" was organized by Cultural Committee and IQAC, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya on 23.01.22 from 5pm to 7pm. Our Principal Dr. Sudhanath Chottopadhyay inaugurated the webinar with his speech on the importance of the day on the youth. After that Manashi Ghosh Dastidar, a senior teacher of our college remembered Netaji through her patriotic song. The welcome address was given by Dr.Antara Chowdhury, Assistant Professor of Bengali. Our honorable chief speaker was Prof. Koushiki Dasgupta, Vidyasagar chair Professor, Department of history, Vidyasagar University. Dr. Pradip Kumar Mandal, Assistant Professor of History introduced her with the faculty and the students. Prof Dasgupta gave a heartwarming speech on the vision and ideas of Netaji on Reconstruction of India. After her speech an interactive session went for around 30 minutes. The program concluded with a recitation on Netaji by a student from Department of education and a song sung by the students of Department of Music. The whole program was conducted by Anwesha Dasgupta, Assistant Professor of Political Science. Total no of participants of the webinar was 73. The positive response we got from the audience marked the success of the webinar. E certificates were delivered to the participants after getting feedback from them.



Workshop on "Mental Health Literacy"

The Department of Education in collaboration with IQAC of Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya organized a one Day State Level seminar cum Workshop on "Mental Health Literacy" on 10th May, 2022 from 12 noon to 3 pm at the college Seminar Room. The resource person was Dr. Sreemoyee Tarafdar, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology, West Bengal State University and Consultant Clinical Psychologist. Dr. Sudhanath Chattopadhyay, Principal, Netaji SatabarshikiMahavidyalayaa inaugurated the programme and delivered a short speech on Mental Health and its relevance in present day context. This was followed by a brief speech by the IQAC coordinator, Dr. Papri Chakrabarti. Then the introductory speech was given by Dr. Moutusi Basak, Librarian, NSM. The entire programme was deftly moderated by Dr. Shree Chatterjee, convener of the said seminar cum workshop. Prof. Tarafdar delivered a comprehensive presentation entitled "Mental Health Literacy". She illuminated the audience with various information related to mental health and also oriented them about different strategies to keep a positive mental state. The programme was mainly organized to create awareness among students who are facing various stress and emotional problems and to maintain a positive mental health through hands-on education. Later she conducted a session with students where students talked about their personal problems. Report of debate competition



Special Camp (Tree plantation)


