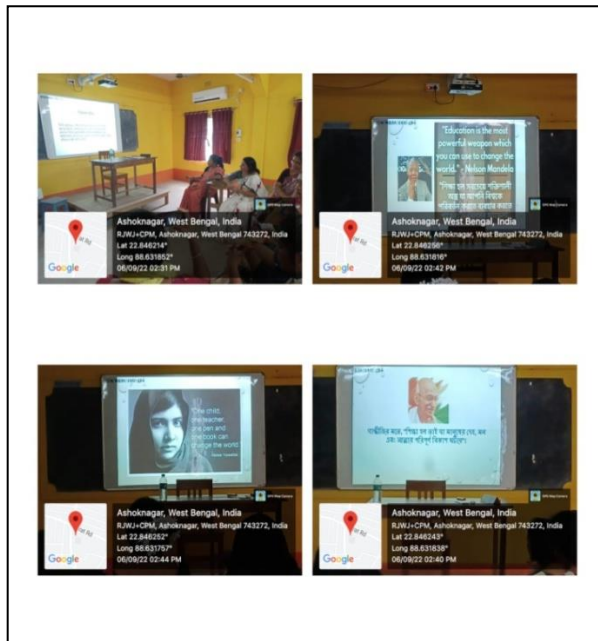


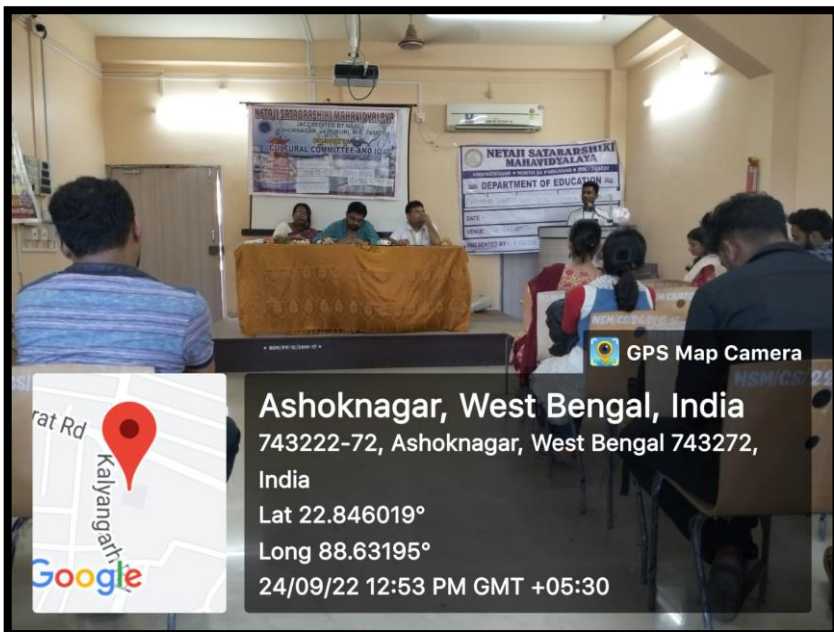
Special Lecture on “Great Educators”

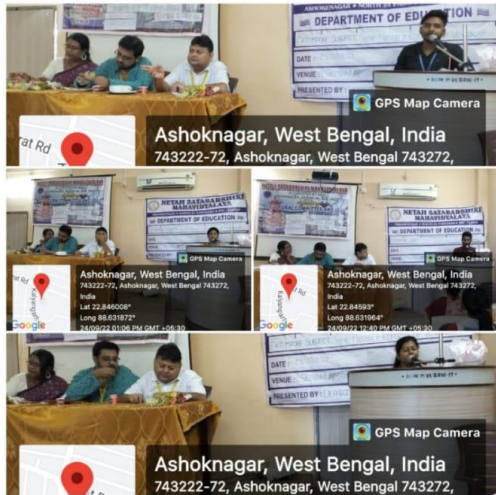

The speaker was Azharuddin, Alumni of Dept. of Education, Netaji SatabarshikiMahavidyalaya. The programme started at 1 P.M. and continued till 3.30 P.M. Around 20 students from the Department of Education participated in this said lecture. The lecture enriched the students about various activities of Rabindranath Tagore, Swami Vivekananda, Mahatma Gandhi, Dr.Sarpapalli Radhakrishnan, Froebel, and Montessori. This lecture also motivated the students by the famous quotes of these great educators.



Extempore Speech Competition on Vidyasagar

On 24th September, 2022, the Department of Education in collaboration with IQAC of Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya organised an extempore speech competition to commemorate the 202nd birth anniversary of Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar, the great educationist and social reformer of India. Students were asked to speak on one of the three topics: Vidyasagar as a social reformer, Vidyasagar as a reformer of education and Vidyasagar's notion of women. The students from all departments actively participated in the programme. Dr. Shree Chatterjee, the Head Department of Education and Convenor of the Cultural Committee hosted the programme. Professor Anindya Dey, Associate professor and H.O.D. of the department of Sociology, Professor Milinda Majumdar, Associate professor of the department of Political Science and Professor Basudha Biswas, Associate Professor of the department of Bengali, assessed the performances delivered based on content and presentation. Five minutes were given to each participant with a warning at 4 minutes as exceeding the stipulated time would amount to negative marking. They imparted invaluable advice to the students as to how they can improve their speech in terms of quality and also how to think and express themselves. The students securing top three positions were awarded and all the participants were given certificates.





' Relevance of Gandhi's Thought in Modern Era' Students Essay Competition

On the occasion of Mahatma Gandhi's 153rd birth anniversary, the Political Science Department in collaboration with IQAC of Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya organized an Essay Competition on 26/9/2022 for the students. The theme of the competition was ' Relevance of Gandhi's Thought in Modern Era'. Nineteen students participated in this competition. The students were asked to present their opinion about the topic. The competition was held in bilingual mode and they were given one hour time to complete the essays. The essays were reviewed by senior teachers of the college and winners were declared on basis of the marks received from the judges.

The aim of the competition was to enhance the students' knowledge on Mahatma Gandhi's political thought. It was an effort on behalf of the Department of Political Science to encourage the students to know about Gandhiji's ideals beyond the syllabus and to understand his relevance in current politics and in our daily lives. The winning students were honored with certificates and prizes on the day of Annual Prize Distribution Ceremony.

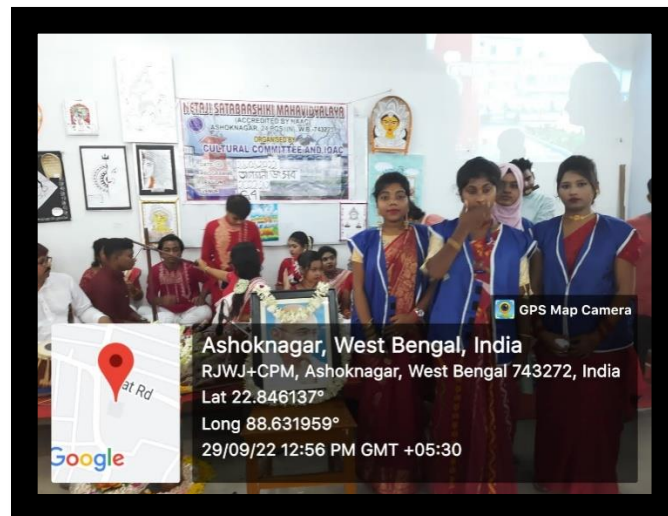

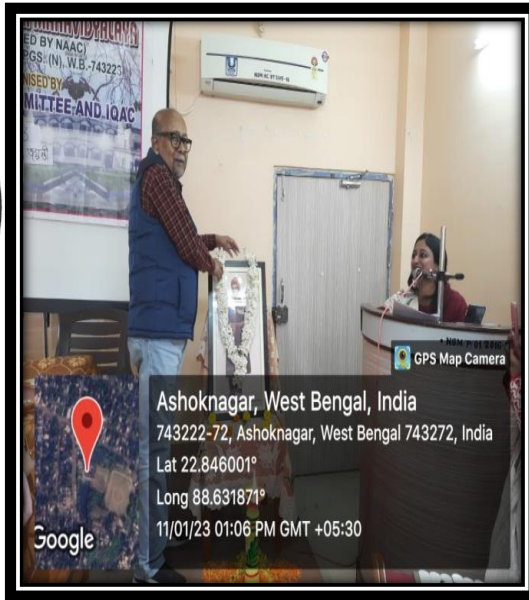
CELEBRATION OF GANDHIJI'S BIRTHDAY

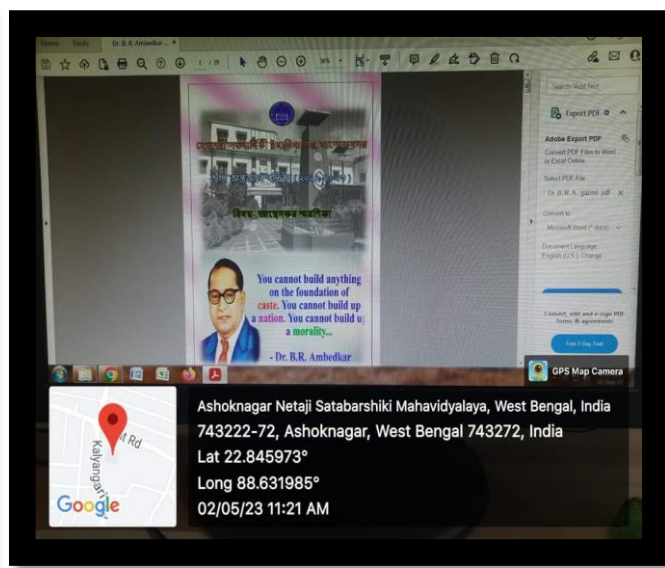
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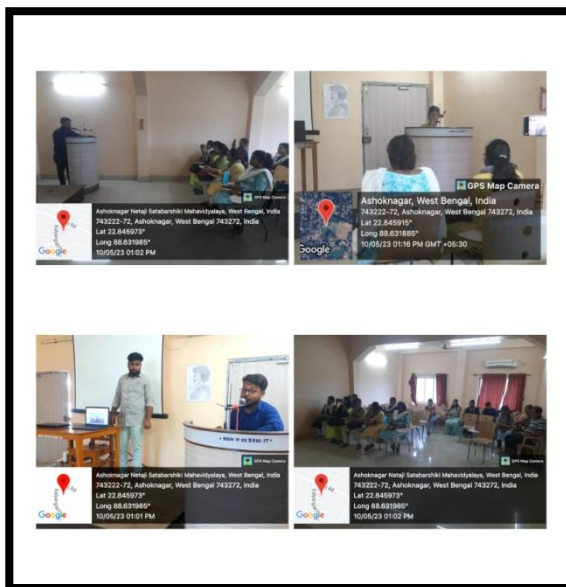
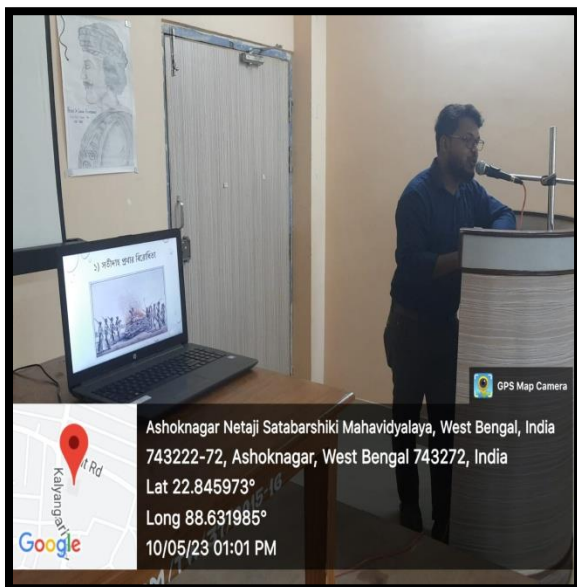
Publication of Ambedkar Smaranika

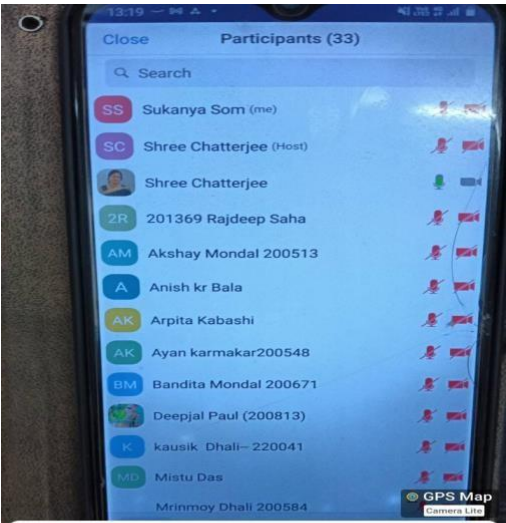


E-lecture on “Lost Childhood: The Tragic Reality of Child Labour and Abuse”

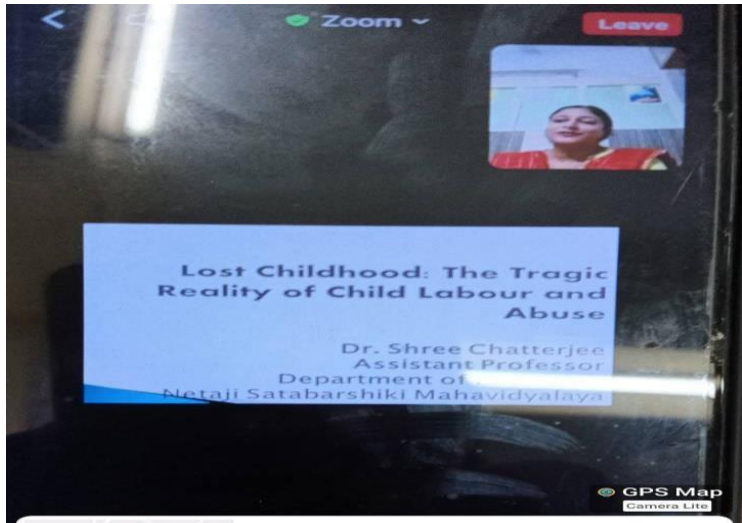

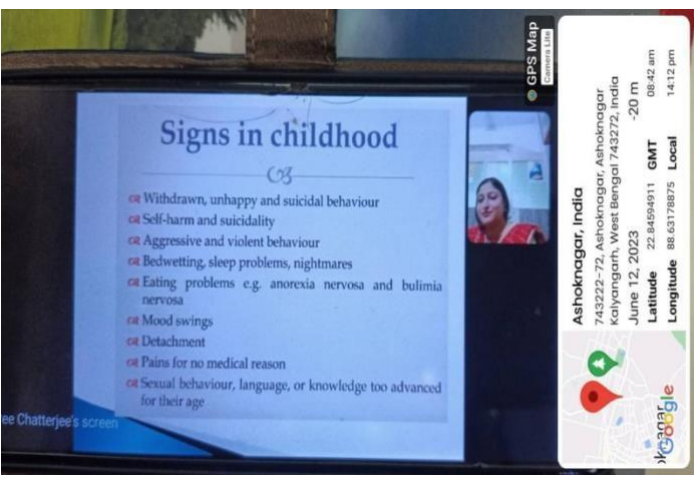
Department of History organized a E-lecture on “Lost Childhood: The Tragic Reality of Child Labour and Abuse” to address the issue of child rights in India for the 6th semester students. The resource person of the E- lecture was Dr. Shree Chatterjee, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Netaji SatabarshikiMahavidyalaya. It was conducted on June 12,2023 which is dedicated to raise awareness about the issue of child labor and children rights worldwide. The speaker talked about child laborers, whom we found everywhere of this country like in tea stalls, in rail stations as forced beggars, domestic service, in labour industries like brick kilns, firecrackers, fisheries and mining. Their childhood becomes horrible when at this mild age (when they belong in schools) they face physical and mental abuse, including sexual exploitation. These exploitation can leads them to severe depression and behavioral disorder. To protect the children of India, Government has enacted the Child Labour Amendment Act, 2016. The Act prohibits the employment of children below 14 years and also enacts punishment for employers for violation of the Act. Not only the act, the speaker also discussed with students about various ways to prevent such abuse. She showed some video clippings and discussed in detail that a safe childhood is a basic human right. They should get education instead of working as labours. She made them aware that as Children are human being, their rights are recognized as fundamental human rights. Children’s rights protects the healthy development of a child. The children thus have the right to live a joyous life and to develop physically and intellectually. It was a two hours long discussion which was very fruitful for student awareness about human rights. Thirty five students attended the E-lecture and got benefited.



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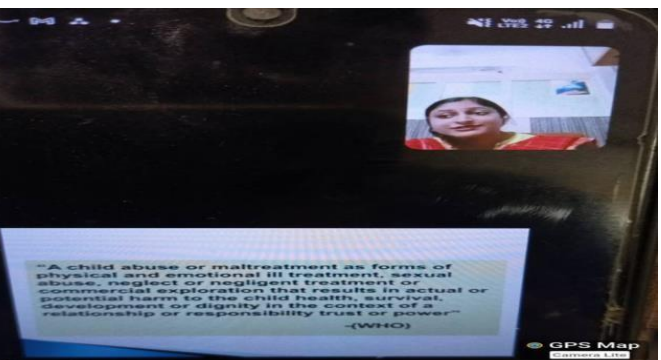
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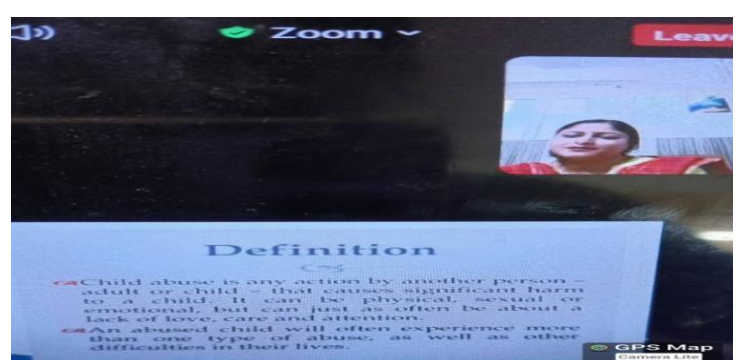
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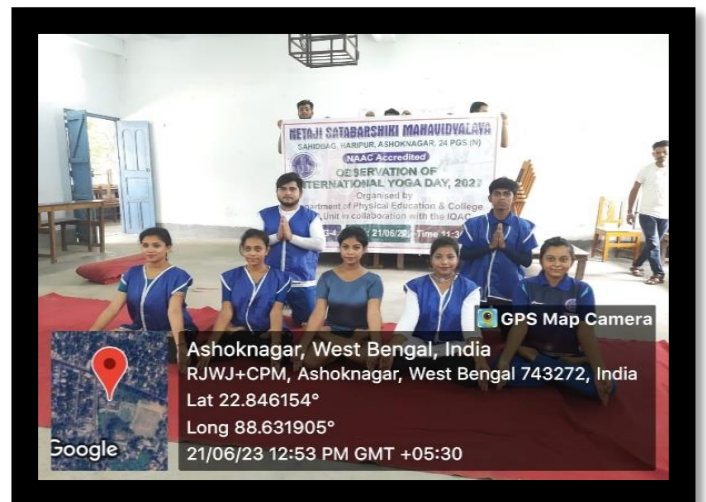
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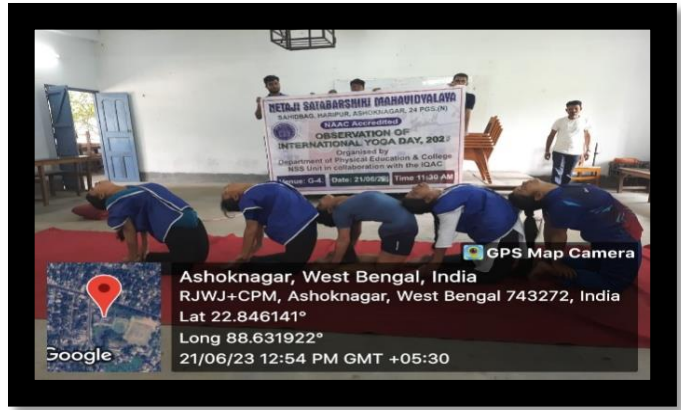


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Observation of the International Yoga day

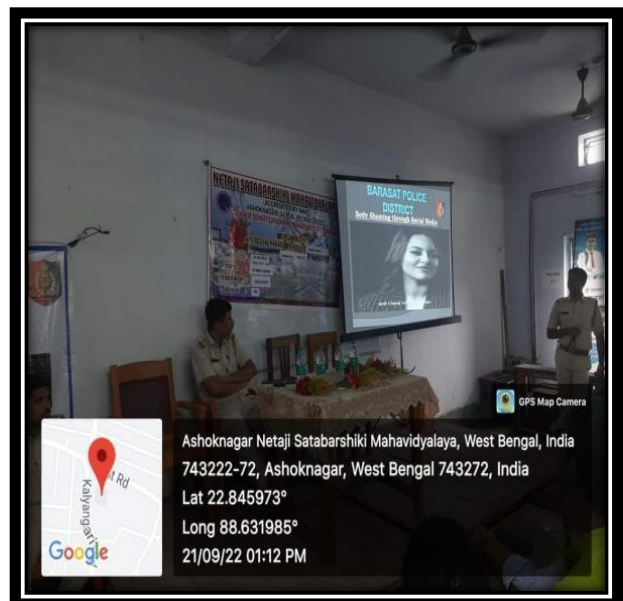
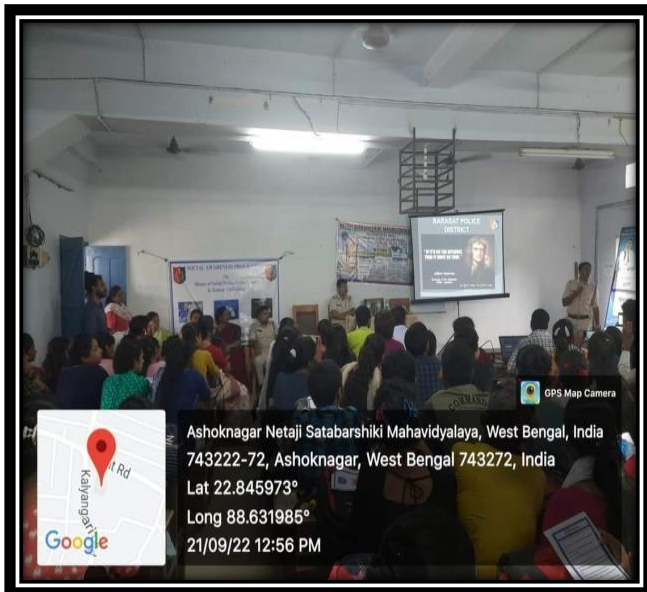
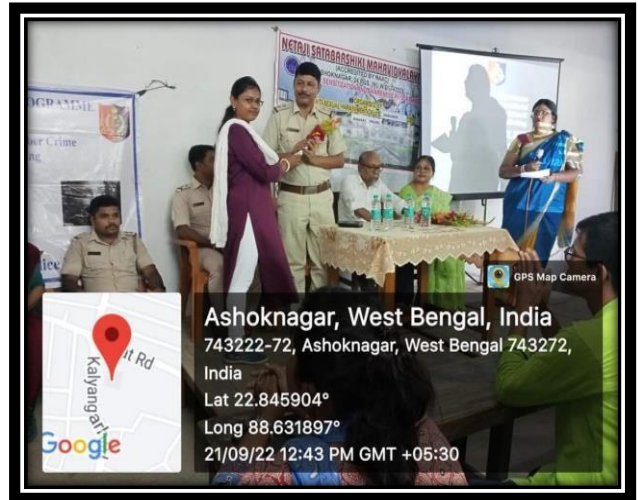

Gender-based abuse in the cyber world is a new threat of the 21st century. These can happen in the form of sexual harassment, threatening, women trafficking, rape, leaking private videos without consent, banking fraud etc. So to aware our students about "Cyber Crime" a Gender sensitization Programme was organized in Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya on 21.09.22. The Gender sensitization Programme was a collaborative effort with the initiative of Barasat Police District and Anti-Sexual harassment cell, Grievance Cell and IQAC of Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya. Our Principal inaugurated the Programme with his speech on the significance of the programme. IQAC Coordinator Dr. Papri Chakraborty gave a short speech on the negative effect of the internet. Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell Convener Sukanya Som conducted the whole Programme. Biplab Sarkar on behalf of Barasat Police District spoke on different alarming issues of Cyber Crime and the safety measures to avoid cyber threat. He particularly stressed about the safety of the women, as women trafficking, threatening of leaking private photos/videos are increasing day by day. Girls students were appealed to not trust any random person in social media without proper knowledge. A large number of students, Professors and staff members participated in the Programme and some of them shared their experiences of cyber threat with Police officials. Officers urged students that in case of any cyber threat or blackmailing they must report it to the police for own safety and punishment of the offender. The eye-opening Gender sensitization Programme on Cyber Crime awareness ended with a vote of thanks to Barasat Police, Ashoknagar Police Station and the College authority by Swastika Biswas, Convener, Grievance Cell. Around one hundred seventy five students attended the awareness programme. They learned a lot of things about cyber crime from this programme which will alert them in trusting unknown people in the social media.
