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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

From quite a humble start Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya, Ashoknagar, now has eighteen years' history on its back. In these years the College has achieved quite a lot. Starting as an affiliated college under the University of Calcutta in 2000, the affiliation of the college was switched to West Bengal State University at Barasat since 2008 like all the other 57 colleges of the district. Now the College has a decent two-storey building comprising of 16 classrooms at present and three specific rooms/labs have been allotted to the departments of Geography, Music and Journalism.

One ICT room as well as one Virtual classroom along with a gym fitted with modern equipments are in use since last two years. An internet-enabled Library with a spacious reading room is also available. It has an air-conditioned stack room for better upkeep of books and journals. The number of students enrolled in this college has grown steadily. Now, the roll-strength of the college is around four thousand. The teaching-learning-evaluation infrastructure and ambience of the college is conducive to academic upliftment. It has struck an exemplary chord among the neighbouring schools and colleges. The results of university examinations over the years speak of our attainment despite having serious shortage of funds, manpower and infrastructure. It seems the college has earned a name among the students to an extent that boys and girls from far-flung areas, village backwaters, from among minority and less-privileged sections of the population throng at the colleges counters during the period of admission to 1st year classes.

Presently the college offers Honours in ten (10) subjects in BA and BSc: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Sociology, Music, Education, Sanskrit and Journalism and Mass Communications. There are thirteen (13) General subjects available in BA and BSc: Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Geography, Sociology, Music, Education, Physical Education, Economics, Sanskrit, Journalism and Mathematics.

A computer course has been started from the 2016-17 sessions on compulsory basis at a reasonable cost. The college Library is steadily being upgraded on all fronts with infrastructural developments -- books, Journals, magazines and e-journals. It is now fully computerised both for staff and students. Presently the number of books in the college Library stands at around 10000. There are reading-room facilities for both faculty and students alike. Apart from the central library, there are departmental libraries of the Honours subjects. They are not large yet, but can cater to the needs of the respective faculty and students.

The college now has a decent Students' Union building just outside the main building of the college within the campus. The college canteen building has come up beside it. The canteen provides a variety of food items at a reasonable price to the staff and students.

The motto of the college has unflinchingly remained to impart the best with the least means. The college was accorded 2(f) and 12B status by the UGC in October, 2011. The college started getting financial assistances for infrastructure, equipments and seminars till February, 2013, when the UGC withdrew our 12B status on the ground that the affiliating university, WBSU, did not have 12B yet. In 2015 WBSU got its 12B status from the UGC. We started correspondences with the UGC to get back our 12B status which finally the college received in March, 2016, after quite a lot of correspondences in letters and over telephone.

For the necessary preparations for NAAC, a lot of development work has been undertaken. Beautification, college Gym, cycle stand with concrete roof, etc., have been duly done. We are looking forward to getting financial assistances from the UGC since the college has been re-accorded 12B.

There is no denying that the college is heading for excellence. Now it also has RTI section with an SPIO, Complaints, and Grievance & Anti-harassment Committee. The NSS Unit of the College is working hard and reaching out to neighbouring community of people. The college is linked with the Students' Health Home that caters to the medical needs of the students at Rs. 10/- a year per student.

Since inception the students of the college have made their marks in the fields of games and sports. The material proofs of their achievements are the trophies and awards, and the honour of participation in national events representing the university.

The college Governing Body, 1st formed in 2008 and now running in its 2nd avatar, has been providing adequate guidance in running the college. The Students' Union is also quite cooperative in all academic and administrative matters concerning students.

Since 2014-15 academic sessions, the college has adopted online admission system which has enormously saved time, trouble, hazards and misconceptions of all concerned. Since 2015-16 sessions, in colleges all over West Bengal this system has been introduced by an order of the Higher Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal. We are a little ahead of others in that respect.

The college received a donation Rs. 10000/ from the eldest son of late Dr. Sadhan Sen for giving award/prizes to two best students of the final year – one from Honours and the other from General course; Sri Anay Kundu in memory of his younger brother who was a meritorious student of our college, but unfortunately committed suicide last year, provided funds for awarding the topper in Bengali Honours every year. The last programme for these awards took place on 11th January this year and will take place regularly on the same date every year, a day ahead of the Birthday of Swami Vivekananda.

It is hoped that the future of the college is bright with the prospect of new courses, both in B.A. and B.Sc, which are to be introduced in a couple of years' time. The CBCS, by its very nature, would also play its role in facilitating greater flexibility in choice of subjects for the enrolled students.

We look forward to march towards academic excellence in coming days. For this to happen all concerned – students, staff, faculty and management – will have to work hard and in a disciplined manner.

Vision:

Since the beginning, the mission of the college has been to inculcate collegiate (degree level) education among the economically challenged and minority community students of neighbouring area from where students throng to get admitted into this college. This vision demands introduction of modern subjects, job oriented courses commensurate with the needs of the day and the conventional subjects of study. The college tries to impart quality knowledge and promote all-round personality development of the students by class-room teaching and creating awareness about their social and cultural milieu. The college has ever since remained true to its goal of developing disciplined individuals who would be at once global in outlook, national in ethos and respectful to local duties and commitments.

- Spread of degree-level education among the economically challenged and minority community students regularly being admitted to the college.
- Introduction of job-oriented and modern subjects to cope with the needs of the day along with the conventional subjects.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) provides greater choices to the students of an institution to select from the prescribed courses (**Core, Elective and Soft-skill courses**). Our affiliating university, West Bengal State University (WBSU), is introducing **CBCS** from 2018-19 academic session and it is proposed that the enrolled students would have to earn their degrees in terms of Credits in six semesters and within five years from the date of the registration. Credit, in this context, refers to a unit by which the course work is measured. Based on the Grades earned, a Grade certificate shall be issued to the students in every semester.

In assessing the students' performance, the institution would award marks based on the examinations conducted at regular intervals (Mid-term, internal, etc.). Students' attendance would also carry 5 marks in every semester.

Under **CBCS**, a undergraduate course is for a period of three years and comprises of six semesters. Each semester would have 15 to 18 weeks of academic work which is equivalent to 90 teaching days. If a student passes a single course in a semester, he doesn't have to repeat the course later. A candidate shall be eligible for the conferment of the Bachelor of Arts or Science degree only if he or she has earned the minimum required credits for the relevant programme. In case of Hons. Candidates, a student has to earn 140 credits in six semesters and in case of General students, the credit requirement comes down to 120.

Change of Stream and Subjects:

Candidates are advised to be very careful in selecting streams, subjects etc. before admission. Prayer for the change of neither the stream nor the subject combination is permitted once admission is taken. The onus of wrong choice of combination, not permitted by the University, shall lie entirely upon the applicant.

College Examination:

The College holds Term Tests in Honours /General Subjects. Other than this examination, the students are advised to sit for class tests as and when conducted by a teacher. The practical examination for the general courses of science stream is taken on the basis of continuous evaluation in the practical classes. The percentage of presence of the students is also allotted considerable share on the total marks. Hence, long absence may result in loss of marks. Absence in any of the above examinations or tests will be considered a break of academic discipline of the College and is to be seriously dealt with unless an exemption has been previously applied for and granted.

Anti Ragging Committee:

The college administration along with the students' union has put in place an Anti-Ragging Committee for building and preserving a culture of Ragging -Free Environment in the Campus. The Functions of Anti Ragging Squad is to keep a strict vigil and stop the incidences of Ragging, if any, happening in places like the classrooms, canteens, grounds, etc. The Squad also educates the students by adopting various means regarding the Menace of Ragging and the related punishments thereto.

Internal quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

The College has established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and since its initiation, the IQAC has been a functioning unit, supervising the Teaching-learning process of the institution. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell contributes to the improvement of the Teaching – learning process in the following ways:

1. By evaluating the quality of teaching learning and taking up such issues as Regularity and punctuality of students and teachers.
2. By monitoring and evaluating the quality of its programmes.
3. By ensuring quality checks of curriculum implementation.
4. By effective implementation of the evaluation reforms of the University.
5. By planning for new courses at Undergraduate level and resolving to open a Post-graduate wing.
6. To plan the teaching- learning process in an innovative way.
7. To initiate seminars and workshops related activities in the relevant subjects.
8. To facilitate greater use of internet facility to access study materials and other academic sites.
9. To encourage the teachers to take part in various Faculty development programmes and research activities.
10. By maintaining the Self-Appraisal Report of the Faculty Members.

Admission Process:

The institution follows the criteria stipulated in the UG Admission regulation of WBSU. For admission in Honours subjects, aggregate marks are calculated by adding the marks of top four subjects in order of marks obtained by a candidate at the H. S. level (+2 level)

Exam. The college publishes the Admission Notice on the college Notice Board. In addition to that the notification is displayed in the college website www.nsmashoknagar.ac.in containing information regarding availability of admission forms, eligibility criteria, and seats with reservation provision as per rule, procedures, fees structures, option for courses and all other information pertaining to the admission criteria. The college Introduced online admissions from the session 2014-15. The technical aspects of this online admission process are taken care of by an agency under the direct control of the college authority. The college prospectus comes out with necessary details relating to admissions and various other information.



Career counselling cell: The cell has been established to counsel our students in relation to the career opportunities in their respective areas. While our teachers help out by offering information and other related data on a regular basis, the invited career- counsellors also visit our college to develop the career plans and job skills of the students.




Parent-Teacher Meeting:

Our institution believes in creating a strong partnership between teachers and parents with the common goal of addressing the concerns and priorities of the students. Meeting with the parents are regularly held and a parent is always welcome to consult the teachers and the college authority if it is necessary.



Seminars/Special Lectures:

Academic seminar and seminars at the community level are regularly organized. Teaching staff as well as the students also participate in the various state, national and international level seminars. Two UGC sponsored state level seminars were organized successfully in 2012. Along with these seminars, special lectures are also arranged with eminent resource persons as speakers.



A Special mention: Dept. of Physical Education

The subject is immensely popular among the students for its practical based curriculum and its prospects in various professions. Hence, the department has a large number of enrolments every year. Together with the usual class- room teaching in the conventional methods and outdoor practical classes, educational tours with the students of the department are arranged on a regular basis to different places of educational and historical importance.

Both indoor and outdoor games related equipments are made available to the students of the college and they regularly take part in inter-college and University sports competitions.



Computer Training Course:

From 2016-17, the “Basic Computer Course” has been made compulsory for all the students irrespective of streams at a very nominal cost. For this purpose, the institution has decided to upgrade the infrastructural facilities including its Wi-Fi connectivity within the campus area.



Fees Concession:

Concession in fees and free studentship may be granted but strictly on the basis of merit of the student and financial condition of their parents under the existing rules. Defaulters in stipulated attendance will not be entertained for such concession.

Students praying for the concession of fees in tuition fees must submit their applications in prescribed format within the notified date. In this regard, students are called for an interview before the Concession Sub-Committee.

Stipend:

Students in need of the scheduled caste/tribe stipend have to produce original certificates in this regard from appropriate authorities at the time of submission of stipend forms.

Kanyashree Prakalpa:

The Form of *Kanyashree Prakalpa* (a conditional cash transfer scheme under the Department of Women Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal) has the aim of improving the status and well- being of the girl child in West Bengal by innervating schooling of teenage girls. The forms are available from the college office.

Students' Canteen:

A new building for College Canteen and students' utility centre was made available to the students. The college canteen has separate seating arrangements for students and staff. Various types of good quality food and refreshment are provided as per need of the students/staff.

Apart from its functional utility, the canteen also becomes a hub of students' interactions.

Special attention is taken to maintain quality of food. Filtered drinking water is also supplied in the College Canteen as well as in every floor.




Students' Health Home:

The College is an institutional member of Students' Health Home located at Habra, a branch of the Central Students' Health Home in Kolkata. Each student of the college is entitled to health assistance from these centres for which he/she has to collect Health Home Card from the college office. A fee of Rs. 10 per year is charged for the card.

College Magazine:

The college publishes a magazine called *Uttarsuri* every year. In this magazine, the students and staff contribute articles and creative pieces. In addition to the annual college Magazine, the wall magazines of various departments also provide an opportunity for the students with a flair for creative writing.

Special arrangements are being made to publish departmental magazines or journals every year.



Educational Tours and Excursions:

Curriculum-based excursions, field trips and field-studies are regularly organized to impart firsthand knowledge to students. The Department of Geography undertakes mandatory study trips with the U.G. students annually. Besides this, the Students of the Humanities stream are sometimes escorted by their teachers for one- day study trips to places of historical and ecological importance. College makes all the necessary arrangements at a nominal cost. Such excursions help in inculcating independent learning and practical skills among our students.



Weather Station:

An automatic weather station (Davis vantage pro2) has been installed at the premises of the college to record the daily meteorological data like rainfall, temperature, relative humidity, wind velocity etc which would in turn be shared with Ashoknagar-Kalyangarh municipality and would thereby help in creating a better environment for the local inhabitants of the area. It will be also effective for the agricultural sector in and around Ashokenagar.

Cultural Activities:

The various cultural programmes, at the college, are organized with the aim to provide our students with the opportunity to engage in creative and artistic activities.



National Service Scheme (NSS):

The NSS wing of the college helps in instilling social awareness and responsibilities along with the environmental awareness among the students. The emphasis is on the “Development of the personality of students through community service”.

Different issue-based awareness programmes of NSS as well as inclusion of Environmental Studies in the Curriculum have made the college students as well the local people aware of the current issues. The college authority also encourages the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as the students to take part in socio-cultural activities and programmes.



Gender sensitization cell:

The college has also set up a Cell for Gender Sensitization and Prevention of Sexual Harassment (CGSPSH) following the UGC directives to look into the matters related to the prevention of sexual harassment and gender discrimination in the college campus. The cell, headed by Dr. Papri Chakrabarti, functions as per the “Vishakha Guidelines” of the Supreme Court. Awareness and counselling programs are regularly taken up by the cell since its inception in 2007. Resource persons are also invited to speak on the gender sensitization related issues.

Students’ Union:

Our affiliating university, WBSU, has put in place an extensive framework for the activities, functions and constitution of the students’ union. This statutory body, in our College, has been playing a vital role in promoting academic interest among the students and also helping the administration to maintain discipline in the college campus. The important activities of the union are itemized below:

Organization of inter-class debate, sports competitions and cultural events.

Organization of recreational activities for students.

Addressing the grievances and various other problems of the students.

Library and learning resources:

A library plays an important role in supporting the academic activities of the college. Keeping this in mind we have been continuously upgrading the library resources keep pace with the ever-increasing requirements of our students. The library is now ready with computerized cataloguing system to help a student reach out to his or her required books. Other than the primary facilities like a spacious reading room, our students are also provided with internet- enabled computers in the library. Departmental libraries are also set up to cater to students' need.
