On 8th August 2023, the Cultural Committee of Netaji Satabarshiki the IQAC of the college, Mahavidvalava, in collaboration with remembered the greatest cultural icon of India, Rabindranath Tagore on his death anniversary through various cultural activities. Dr. Papri Chakrabarti, the IQAC coordinator of the college who was also incharge of the college for that day in absence of the T.I.C., inaugurated the programme and delivered a short speech. She lighted the lamp and planted a tree. The theme of the programme pertaining the environment was much relevant for contemporary times. This was an apt way of remembering Tagore as he undertook the activity of "Halakarshana" in 1928 during the month of Shantiniketan to underscore the importance of agriculture and in a broader sense, the earth as the source of sustenance of all sorts for humans who tend to forget it. The month of Sravan evoked the emotions of new creation, plenitude as depicted in "Barshamangal" by Tagore. Not only poetic creation but Tagore implemented these thoughts of creativity in reality through planting trees and espousing that nature should be deified. He apotheosized environment to inculcate a deep faith and gratitude in the minds of the people and the "vanmahotsav" was the manifestation of Tagore's such thoughts. Dr. Shree Chatterjee, convenor of the Cultural Committee who moderated the programme harped on these concepts thus enriching the audience present. A few songs from Barshamangal were sung. 22nd Sravan, the death anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore was announced as national afforestation day by the Government of India. In Shantiniketan, a week long programme starting from 7th August and consisting of these activities, is held. This is how Tagore remains relevant today. Dr. Antara Chowdhury, Assistant Professor of the department of Bengali delivered the valedictory speech and a representative from the Student's Council also paid their homage to Tagore.

On the first day volunteers planted 10 sablings and taken pledge on panchpran.15 volunteers and 4 teachers participated in this programme.



Krishna Mitra gave valuable lectures in theory class. As a resource, Ms. Sangita Chakraborty, a member of Ashoknagar Natyamukh Natyadal, trained the participants in practical class.

The primary objective

- To provide unlimited opportunities for the expansion of creative minds.
- To build capable citizens of the society through training in the collective performance of a task.
- To provide professional opportunities through the entertainment world and social media through training in theatre.

A report on the Soft Skills Certificate Course, 2023-24

With a view to provide students with some additional employability skills within the college premises, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya offered the Soft Skills Certificate Course in the Odd semester of 2023-24 session. It was a collaboration between the departments of English, Journalism and Mass Communications and Mathematics. The course covered some basic soft skills like spoken English skills, tips on self-grooming, basic skills of facing an interview, knowledge about body language, formal and non-formal communications, basic techniques of formal correspondence, self-introduction among others. The curriculum was designed by the teachers of the college who took the responsibility of teaching and continuous assessment as well as end-term exam. The course convenor was Prama Bhattacharjee, Dept. of English. The other teachers were Rosona Khatun Moumita Sarkar, both from the dept. of Journalism and Mass and Communications, Dr. Abhirup Datta from dept. of Mathematics and Ranit Ray from dept. of English. The classes were taken primarily in the offline mode, and during the puja vacation, a part of the curriculum was taught in online mode. At the end of the course the students were assesses both with written examination as well as interviews. Only those who secured pass marks in total assessment, were provided with certificates. Although 69 students had initially enrolled for the course, only 17 students were provided with certificates after fulfilling the basic criteria.



The course would be covering the following topics. In addition, study materials and useful links would be given in a WhatsApp group created exclusively for this purpose.

2. Applied grammar and basic translation.

 3. Body language, Haptics and Proxemics, etiquettes, how to face an interview: planning and preparation. group discussion.
- 4. Emotional intelligence and critical thinking, leadership skills, management and adaptability. S. How to write application, email and report, creating ppt and projects, Self-grooming: developing good habits.
- Verbal communication skills and listening skills, non-verbal communication and telephonic communication etc.

Workshop on Area Studies: Local history of Ashoknagar SESSION: 2023 – 2024




In the academic session 2023-24, the department of History, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya organized a workshop on Area studies to sensitize our students about the local history of Ashoknagar. Another aim of the workshop was to create a research-oriented mentality among the General stream students. The Area Studies workshop was an attempt at making the students understand the Importance of knowing local history instead of gaining only bookish Knowledge. The department started preparing for the workshop and it was arranged on 10.10.2023 at the F5 Classroom. Around 62 general students of semester five participated in the workshop. At first they were informed what is area studies, Why they should know about it, how it is linked with the local history studies. Then HoD, History, Sukanya Som discussed with students the different aspects of the history of Ashoknagar with Power point presentation, Swastika Biswas, Assistant professor, department of History analyzed some historically important locations and presented photos of historical importance pertaining to the local history of Ashoknagar. They also inspired the students to start the area studies

research by themselves under the guidance of the departmental teachers focusing more on refugee studies, partition studies & diaspora studies. The workshop successfully managed to inspire the students to move beyond the elitist dynastic historiography and delve deeper into such necessary interventions like local history, women history, sub-altern history and so on. The workshop, in perfect semblance with existing and contemporary research methodologies, promoted the need of a decentralized historiography, accommodating multiple perspectives & multi layerdness of historical narrations. The students, as it is hoped by the department would turn out to be not merely inquisitive learners but also active agents in the narration of history in this process.

Press Laws and Regulations: Their Significance and Effect in the Context of the Colonial Era

Department of History organized a student On 13/12/23 interdepartmental seminar for sem V students on "Press Laws and Regulations: Their Significance and Effect in the Context of the Colonial Era". Rosona Khatun, SACT, Department of Journalism & Mass Communication was the resource person for the seminar. The seminar started at 11am and was inaugurated by Dr. Antara Chowdhury, IQAC Coordinator with a short speech on the importance of the seminar. HoD Sukanya Som welcomed the resource person and discussed the context of the said seminar. After that the speaker discussed briefly on Indian Press laws and restrictions during the British era. Newspapers played a big role in arising nationalism among the countrymen. It not only published the torturous side of the colonial rule but also focused on British exploitation, socio-economic issues, which created mass agitation against the government. As a result The colonial administration imposed a series of restrictions suppressing print media that spoke against the British Govt. Thus press in India faced lots of oppression in colonial era but Indians fought against such restrictions upon freedom of speech. As India became a democratic country after Independence, the media has now become the 4th pillar of it. The seminar continued for two hours and at the end of it there was a very enlightening interactive session with the students. Teachers too participated in this discussion. The seminar was attended by forty two students. The program ended with a vote of thanks by Swastika Biswas, Assistant Professor, History.

themes. They could write an essay either in English or in Bengali. The topics for writing



Through this performance they have been able to get a special idea about the dialogues, gestures and among other aspects of drama presentation of different characters.










FIRE SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME

NETAJI SATABARSHIKI MAHAVIDYALAYA CAREER COUNSELLING CELL IN COLLABORATION WITH IQAC, ORGANIZED WORKSHOP ON

SELF EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES IN FISHERY & AQUACULTURE SECTORS IN RURAL WEST BENGAL

On 08.01.2024 as part of student week program, Career Counselling Cell in association with the IQAC of the college organized a one day workshop on Self Employment Opportunities In Fishery & Aquaculture Sectors In Rural West Bengal at room no G4 for the students. The aim of the workshop was to provide students an alternative path towards self-employment. As most of our students are from backward rural areas, the workshop will open up a new carrier venture opportunity for them. The resource person of the workshop was Sri Subrato Ghosh, Assistant Fishery Officer, Directorate of Fisheries, Government of West Bengal at South 24 Parganas, Kolkata. The program started at 12pm with a speech by Smt. Sukanya Som, convener, Career Counselling Cell on the need of self employment among the youth. IQAC coordinator Dr. Antara Chowdhury inaugurated the workshop with a note on the relevance of the workshop. The resource person was introduced and welcomed by Smt. Prama Bhattacharjee, member, Career Counselling Cell. The resource person began with an interactive discussion with the students about the condition of local ponds & water bodies, their eagerness to be self-employed, their opinion about fishes etc. Fish and fish products are one of the most loved food item in the food habit of around 60% of Indian people which have a great nutrition values too. He gave a PowerPoint presentation on different aspects of pisciculture and aquaculture & discussed the difference between fresh water and aguaculture. Freshwater brackish water aguaculture includes breeding of freshwater fish like carp, catla, rohu, freshwater prawn, freshwater pearl farming. Brackish water aquaculture involves fish production that habitat the sea like sea bass, grey mullet, shrimp, mud crabs. Fish farming has a huge market base and practiced widely in West Bengal. He focused on the fastest growing Fishery sector in India

which has a huge potential to provide employment opportunities in various fields- culture fishery activities, fish processing, production, transportation, freezing, packaging, selling etc. Growing self-initiatives in fisheries is leading India to be one of the world's largest seafood suppliers. So it can be a profitable business venture for youths after completing education. Thus he encouraged our students to think about independent entrepreneurship in the fishery sector instead of focusing only on 10 to 5 office jobs through this workshop. The workshop was attended by around eighty five students who found it very interesting and some of them had different quarries regarding fish farming in their own household or ponds. Sri Subrato Ghosh answered all their queries elaborately. It was a very beneficial workshop for students towards self-employment. 






Department of History, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya in collaboration with the IQAC organised an interdisciplinary student awareness seminar on Women rights in India on 04.03.24. The speaker of the seminar was Dr. Shree Chatterjee, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya. The Indian constitution has prohibited discrimination against women and encourages Indian Government to take measures to safeguard women rights. But sadly crimes against women are increasing day by day. In many cases it has been seen that victim women are unaware of their rights and women centric laws. As a result, they fear to protest or to lodge complains againstaccusers. So to aware our students about women rights in our country as well as women centric laws, the seminar was arranged. At the beginning of the seminar, HoD Sukanya Som gave a short speech on the importance

of knowing about women rights in India and introduced our speaker to the students. Dr. Shree Chatterjee then showed power point presentation and discussed in detail in a chronological way, the evolution of women rights from the nineteenth century to the modern times. The colonial Government in India passed different women centric acts like abolition of 'satidaha pratha', Widow remarriage act, Age of consent act etc. which raised awareness among Indians to think of women progress in India. After 1947, Independent India witnessed a concern for women through the constitution of India which was reflected in number of acts like - All India women equality, the maternity benefit act, prohibition of child marriage act, the dowry prohibition act, The national commission for women act 1990, the protection of women from sexual offences act, equal pay for equal work act etc. She talked elaborately on these acts and regulations, asked students to aware society so that women can raise voice against discrimination, molestation and any kind of violence against them. Students also raised some quarries regarding women rights which was nicely answered by the speaker. Thus it became an interesting interaction session among the speaker and the audience. Thirty two students and five teachers participated in the awareness seminar on women rights. The seminar ended with a vote of thanks by Swastika Biswas, Assistant Professor, department of history to the speaker and the students.



Add-on Course in the Department of Geography, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya: Academic Session 2023-24

The Department of Geography at Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya successfully conducted a specialized add-on course titled "Tools and Techniques in Geomorphic Studies: Practical Applications and Case Studies" from March 15 to April 30, 2024. This comprehensive report outlines the course structure, implementation, and outcomes, demonstrating its effectiveness in enhancing students' practical knowledge and research capabilities in geographical studies.

Course Overview and Implementation

The course was meticulously designed to provide students with both theoretical knowledge and practical field experience in geomorphological studies. The program attracted 23 participants and was structured as a 40-hour blended learning module. The curriculum was thoughtfully divided into three main components: 18 hours of direct classroom teaching, 18 hours of field training, and 4 hours

dedicated to course evaluation, ensuring a well-rounded educational experience.


A significant highlight of the program was the incorporation of expert knowledge through special lectures. Two distinguished external experts, Dr. Swagata Bera from Dum Dum Motijheel College and Mr. Sayan Mandal from Sarojini Naidu College for Women, each conducted two-hour sessions. These collaborations were facilitated through existing Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) from previous academic sessions, demonstrating the institution's commitment to maintaining strong academic networks.

Field Training Component

The field training component, conducted from March 19 to 21, 2024, took place at Sagar Island and Ghoramara Island in West Bengal. This practical exposure provided students with invaluable hands-on experience in monitoring and identifying coastal landform dynamics, studying coastal erosion patterns, and understanding coastal management strategies. Additionally, students gained insights into local livelihood patterns, integrating human geography aspects with physical geography studies.

Evaluation Methodology and Student Performance

The course employed a comprehensive evaluation system consisting of two components: a 50- mark multiple-choice examination testing theoretical knowledge, and a 50-mark assessment of





field performance and participation in group discussions.

This balanced approach ensured that

both theoretical understanding and practical application

skills were adequately assessed.

The student performance analysis reveals impressive

results. Out of 23 participants, 19 students achieved an 'A'

grade or higher, with two students securing an A+ grade.

remaining four students received B grades,

maintaining a satisfactory standard of performance. The

highest combined score was 89 marks, achieved through

exceptional performance in both theoretical and practical

components.

Notable performance indicators include:

Average examination score: 41.6 out of 50

Average field performance score: 38.0 out of 50

Overall pass rate: 100%

A/A+ grade achievement rate: 82.6%

Student Achievement Analysis

The results demonstrate remarkable consistency in student

performance across both theoretical and practical components.

The field performance scores were particularly strong, with

many students scoring above 35 out of 50, indicating successful

achievement of the course's practical training objectives. The

theoretical component scores also showed strong results, with several students scoring above 45 out of 50 in the multiplechoice examination.

Course Outcome


The successful completion of this add-on course represents a significant achievement in specialized geographical education. The high-performance metrics and positive outcomes validate the effectiveness of the blended learning approach and the integration of field studies with theoretical knowledge. The course has successfully fulfilled its objectives of enhancing students' specialized learning levels and providing them with practical exposure to geomorphological studies.

The strong academic performance across both theoretical and practical components suggests that the course structure and delivery methods were well-designed and effectively implemented. The inclusion of external expertise through special lectures added valuable perspectives and



enhanced the learning experience. The field training component particularly stood out as a crucial element in developing students' practical skills and understanding of real-world geographical phenomena.

This course serves as a model for future specialized geographical education programs, demonstrating the value of combining classroom learning with practical field experience and expert guidance. The high success rate and quality of student performance indicate that similar programs should be continued and potentially expanded in future academic sessions.



Through their songs they sparked the idea in 19th century Bengal that music can raise nationalistic feelings among people. These

songs were recognized as patriotic songs during the 'Swadeshi Movement' in Bengal. Some of the most popular 'Atulprasadi' songs of these period were "Utho go Bharat Laxmi", "Bolo bolo bolo sobe", "Hao dhoromete dhir" etc. Dwigendrageeti that became "gana Sangeet" (mass songs)were "Bango amar janani amar", "Dhano dhanya pushpobhora amader ei boshundhora" etc. Rajnikanta Sen created magic in arising patriotic sentiments among the youth through his songs like "Mayer deya mota kapor mathaye tuley nerey bhai". These songs were hummed by the mass in the fight against the oppressive British Government. These songs ignited the spirit of nationalism among the mass. Dr. Chakrabarti not only gave speech on the topic, the students of department of Music played a graceful musical performance on these songs which mesmerized the students and the teachers. Such seminar really boosted up the human values of the students and their knowledge about growth of Indian nationalism was increased. Around forty five students attended the seminar. The student seminar ended with vote of thanks by Smt. Swastika Biswas, Assistant Professor, Department of history.













ONE DAY SPECIAL LECTURE

Netaji Shatbarshiki Mahavidyala Department Of Bengali Report on seminar of Sharodindu Bandopadhyay Session - 23-24












World Book Day, 23rd April, 2024
