Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya observed International Women's Day on 12.03.24 (as 08.03.24 was a holiday in WB) by organizing a student awareness event. The Women's Cell of the college in this regard arranged a two dimentional program on Self defence and women's



empowerment. At the beginning of the program two short movie clips and one Government sponsored documentary film were shown to the students. These movie clips portrayed short stories of three different kinds of crimes that generally happen against women in a patriarchal society; like acid attack, child marriage and domestic violence and also the defensive

acts that helped those victim women to protest against such social evils. Students were enlightened by watching the fighting spirit of the women against the injustices. The characters not only empowered themselves by fighting back but also voiced for women rights. After the film projection, our IQAC Coordinator Dr. Antara Chowdhury gave an inspiring speech on women in different professional sectors being successful today. Women's cell convener Sukanya Som asked the students, particularly the girls to learn about the basic self-defence tactics for their own safety in case they face violence or get ill-treated. Thus the awareness program was fruitful as students became Conscious about women safety and the idea of self-defence mechanism!. Around forty five students attended the program enthusiastically.


















POSTER COMPETITION







Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya Department of History Interdisciplinary student awareness seminar on WOMEN RIGHTS IN INDIA Session 2023-24

Department of History, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya in collaboration with the IQAC organised an interdisciplinary student awareness seminar on Women rights in India on 04.03.24. The speaker of the seminar was Dr. Shree Chatterjee, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya. The Indian constitution has prohibited discrimination against women and encourages Indian Government to take measures to safeguard women rights. But sadly crimes against women are increasing day by day. In many cases it has been seen that victim women are unaware of their rights and women centric laws. As a result, they fear to protest or to lodge complains against accusers. So to aware our students about women rights in our country as well as women centric laws, the seminar was arranged. At the beginning of the seminar, HoD Sukanya Som gave a short speech on the importance of knowing about women rights in India and introduced our speaker to the students. Dr. Shree Chatterjee then showed power point presentation and discussed in detail in a chronological way, the evolution of women rights from the nineteenth century to the modern times. The colonial Government in India passed different women centric acts like abolition of 'satidaha pratha', Widow remarriage act, Age of consent act etc. which raised awareness among Indians to think of women progress in India. After 1947, Independent India witnessed a concern for women through the constitution of India which was reflected in number of acts like - All India women equality, the maternity benefit act, prohibition of child marriage act, the dowry prohibition act, The national commission for women act 1990, the protection of women from sexual offences act, equal pay for equal work act etc. She talked elaborately on these acts and regulations, asked students to aware society so that women can raise voice against discrimination, molestation and any kind of violence against them. Students also raised some quarries regarding women rights which was nicely answered by the speaker. Thus it became an interesting interaction session among the speaker and the audience. Thirty two students and five teachers participated in the awareness seminar on women rights. The seminar ended with a vote of thanks by Swastika Biswas, Assistant Professor, department of history to the speaker and the students.
