- Feed Back System (from the stakeholders)
 - I. For the NAAC AQAR (2023-24), the college obtains feedback from Students of different disciplines on the syllabus through the college website. The questionnaire has been framed to cover the syllabus's social, economic, and contemporary aspects. Students have rated the question on a scale of E to A where E= Very poor, D = Poor, C = Satisfactory, B = Good, and A = Excellent. The feedback is calculated on a numerical scale of 0 – 4, where 0 stands for E, i.e., Very poor, and four stands for A, i.e., Excellent. The college got 3.34 (curriculum) and 3.38 (Academic ambiance) points from the feedback of the 6th Semester, which indicates that our college is quite capable of fulfilling their expectation.
 - II. For the NAAC AQAR (2023-24), the college obtains feedback from Teachers of different disciplines on the syllabus through the college website. The questionnaire has been framed to cover the syllabus's social, economic, and contemporary aspects. Teachers have rated the question on a scale of E to A, where E= Very poor, D = Poor, C = Satisfactory, B = Good, and A = Excellent. The feedback is calculated on a numerical scale of 0 – 4, where 0 stands for E, i.e., Very poor, and 4 stands for A, i.e., Excellent. The college got 3.2 (curriculum) and 3.21(Academic ambiance) points from the teachers, encouraging them to perform better for the next academic session.

- Infrastructural augmentation for the teaching-learning environment
 - a) During the current Academic session new almirahs, cabinets, benches, chairs and tables were purchased from the fund sanctioned on 01.11.2023 by the West Bengal Govt, Higher Education Department and distributed to all the departments.
 - b) 2 new classrooms were built during the current year which would allow more flexibility to the academic environment of the college.
 - c) The building committee started working on the auditorium on the top floor. Finance passed the proposal, but the scarcity of funds is a big problem in finishing the plan and hence will be completed in a phased manner.
 - d) A seating arrangement for the guardians of the Divyangjan students under a shade has been made just outside the college so that they can accompany the students in case of necessity.
 - e) The Maintenance Committee supervised the installation of three new water purifiers with chillers and the repair of two old purifiers in order to ensure pure and clean drinking water.
 - f) 26 CCTVs were installed in the college premises and shade of the outside garage to ensure a safe and secure environment for all students and staff within the campus and its vicinity.

- g) Eight Air Conditioners were also installed in the library reading room and laboratories.
- h) The Online Exam Portal was revamped thereby enabling the students to practice and achieve better results in future career pursuit. Group discussions and mock interviews are arranged for the personality development skills of the students.
- c) **To encourage self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations in higher education;**
- The mentors have successfully broadened the horizon of the varied experiences of their students. With their guidance and support, the students try to identify their potential and skills to pursue excellence in their chosen fields. The mentors also contacted the irregular students and made them understand the value of education, which helped them restart their educational journey. The mentors also contacted the female students who left education due to family pressure or marital issues. They convinced them to complete their education to be financially independent in the future. The mentors conveyed the priorities and demands of the students to the institution so that it could introduce Add-on courses that could fulfill students' requirements. The mentors also identify financially insecure students and help them get concessions from the college while they are admitted.

He, along with other members of the said committee, distributed the blankets to the listed villagers who are extremely poor and belong to tribal community. By distributing blankets, our college took a small step to help them.

Blankets were distributed amongst 40 underprivileged villagers of Keotsa village under Srikrishnapur-Noorpur Gram Panchayat of Ashoknagar Assembly Constituency. The members of the committee distributed the blankets to the listed villagers who belong to SC, OBC, and Minority communities. The college has earned a name among higher education-seekers, so much so that boys and girls from far-flung areas and from among minority as well as and underprivileged sections of the population seek admission to get into the 1st year classes of BA & BSc. The minority and backward class students comprise a large portion of the roll strength, and thus, it is our responsibility to reach out to these students and address their aspirational needs. In winter our college took a small step in helping the poor villagers by distributing blankets.
