BEST PRACTICE 1

1. Title of the Practice: Exploration of the physical and human centric aspects at Ashoknagar and surrounding areas (LOCAL AREA RESEARCH).

2. objectives:

- To involve students and teachers in local area research activities at Ashoknagar and surrounding areas.
- To improve students' overall educational experience and create greater motivation for application-based knowledge around a particular location.
- To investigate the challenges and their probable answers to the questions people of the locality are faced with.
- To implement the suggestions given by the local people towards classroom teaching and in the process bridging the gap between the researchers and the local area under survey.

C) The Context:

The Research Committee felt the need to explore areas in Ashok Nagar and surrounding areas. The idea of local area research is becoming increasingly important for both students and teachers to understand and interpret the history of an area. The peculiarity of a particular locality, its people and the socio-economic standards need to be taken into account if we want to cater to the needs of the people. Even in a globalized scenario, regional forms of knowledge need to be understood as local people continue to prefer concrete knowledge which belongs to them. Ashoknagar has a long history of political activism, post-partition struggle of uprooted people and a vibrant culture. Through the LAR projects, we aim to:

- involve our students in gathering relevant knowledge about the locality.
- develop students' understanding of the local culture, its economic parameters, and other relevant areas. This knowledge would further develop a social responsibility among the students.
- initiate ways to ensure greater participation of the local people and their feedback in the various Add-on/skill-based programs at the institutional level.

D) PRACTICE

Ashoknagar research project is a flagship initiative of our institution to bring forth a holistic delineation of Ashoknagar ranging from socio-political, demographic, economic, literary and cultural to geographical aspects. The project began last session with our thirteen departments working on diverse issue areas centering Ashoknagar under the aegis of NSM research committee. The departments have submitted their research proposals with a tentative budget to the research

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
committee and after discussion with the IQAC and college administration these were approved with required modifications.

In the session 2023-24, the departments undertook an initial pilot survey in their selected wards or places to gather preliminary information, talk to relevant people and have an idea of how they will proceed further. A report of the pilot surveys was also sent to the research committee for discussion and deliberation. The research committee members interacted with the heads of the departments regularly to discuss the progress and the difficulties that they encountered during the pilot survey. The research committee along with the IQAC initiated a meeting with the local municipality and the chairman to discuss the various research proposals and the intent to do student surveys on different wards and places. The initiative to involve the local Municipal authorities was to get more inputs and insights from them and to seek their help with relevant resources on Ashoknagar. The departments have duly submitted their questionnaires to the research committee and after approval they have begun the initial survey. Students are divided into small groups and they are accompanied by teachers to the selected locations where they conduct surveys according to their questionnaires and also interact with local people and interview important personalities in Ashok Nagar. To make the process cost effective different departments working in areas which are in vicinity are going together on a specific date to save on travel expenses. The departments are conducting the surveys and noting relevant information which they are communicating to the research committee on regular intervals. The research committee is taking note of the progress of the project by seeking reports, documentations or presentations from the departments. Since this is a collaborative effort, discussions and deliberations among the research committee, the faculties of the departments and the students form the foundation of the Ashok Nagar project.

The intent is to gather pertinent information, define the areas of progress and mark areas of shortcoming or problems to develop a critical understanding of Ashoknagar on diverse fronts. The project aims to provide valuable insights, define the areas of limitations and deficiency and advance problem-solving ideas or methods to engage in enrichment of the adjoining society and positively contribute to the rich and diverse tapestry of Ashoknagar.

E) EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS

Ongoing LAR projects have already created a greater awareness among the students and the faculty about the heritage, socio-cultural resources and opportunities that Ashoknagar and its surrounding areas possess. As these students visit different institutions and talk to people of the region, we can sense a gradual development of leadership skills and a good work-ethic among the students. This has also helped them to develop their communication skills including their power of expression and listening which further enhanced their skill of critical thinking. The students have gathered not only specific data in their respective field under the supervision of their teachers, they have also utilized this opportunity to sharpen their social and ethical values like respecting differences among individuals, respecting others' values and culture. In other words, Local area research projects have helped our students to develop an empathetic approach towards the local people and their issues.


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PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED

- a) Students are not yet fully prepared to handle and process the varied data in a given Local Area research project.
- b) Our students are still learning the skill set required to prepare a questionnaire or the skill in conducting an interview session with the local people as per requirement.
- c) Funding all these Local Area research projects at the college level is a difficult job.
- d) Finding relevant data at times is proving difficult too.

Online 'Student Profile Mapping'

Title of the Practice – Online' Student Profile Mapping' Portal

Objectives:

To determine the abilities of students in an objective and quantifiable manner and identify the slow and advanced learners so that appropriate support can be provided by the institution.

The Context:

Students often face diverse challenges with respect to their skill attributes: while some may belong to economically backward families and have access to limited resources; some may be intellectually bright or slow irrespective of their economic status; others may have different skills, emotions and behaviour. A systematic assessment of these attributes of the students may help in providing an insight into their strengths and weaknesses. The profile mapping exercise enables the institution to hone the students' strengths and overcome their weaknesses.

The Practice:

- Students need to login with their login ID and password and answer an online questionnaire.
- Scores on 'General Quotient (GQ)' and 'Empowerment Quotient (EQ)' are calculated on the basis of the answers provided. The General Quotient comprises of Academic score, Intelligence score and Knowledge score. The Empowerment Quotient assesses different types of abilities. It also makes a comparison of the particular student in comparison with his/her peer group. Finally, a weighted average of GQ and EQ gives the final score, which represents the capability of the student.



Evidence of success:

- The manual method of psychometry test or profile mapping is too engaging and time consuming, whereas the online mapping is fast, accurate and error-free.
- Marks obtained in class/internal tests are not always reflective of the students' ability; external factors may affect their time spent on studies, understanding of the subject and answer writing skills. However, online mapping appraises their innate capabilities.
- Often, teachers depend on students' class performance or behaviour to gauge their level of knowledge or aptitude. However, this method is suitable only for articulate students. Online mapping is equally effective for shy and introvert students.
- The teachers assert that their assessment about the students matches with the profile mapping results, which confirms to the authenticity of the mapping mechanism.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- The major problem pertains to availability of internet facilities in college. The existing computer infrastructure is inadequate so that online profile mapping takes longer than usual time.
- The students, mostly from poor families have limited access to high-speed data connection.
- Often the students are unable to understand the questions, and so need the guidance of teachers for filling the questionnaire.
- The resources required are competent software developer to implement the entire idea of online profile mapping along with adequate computer infrastructure.

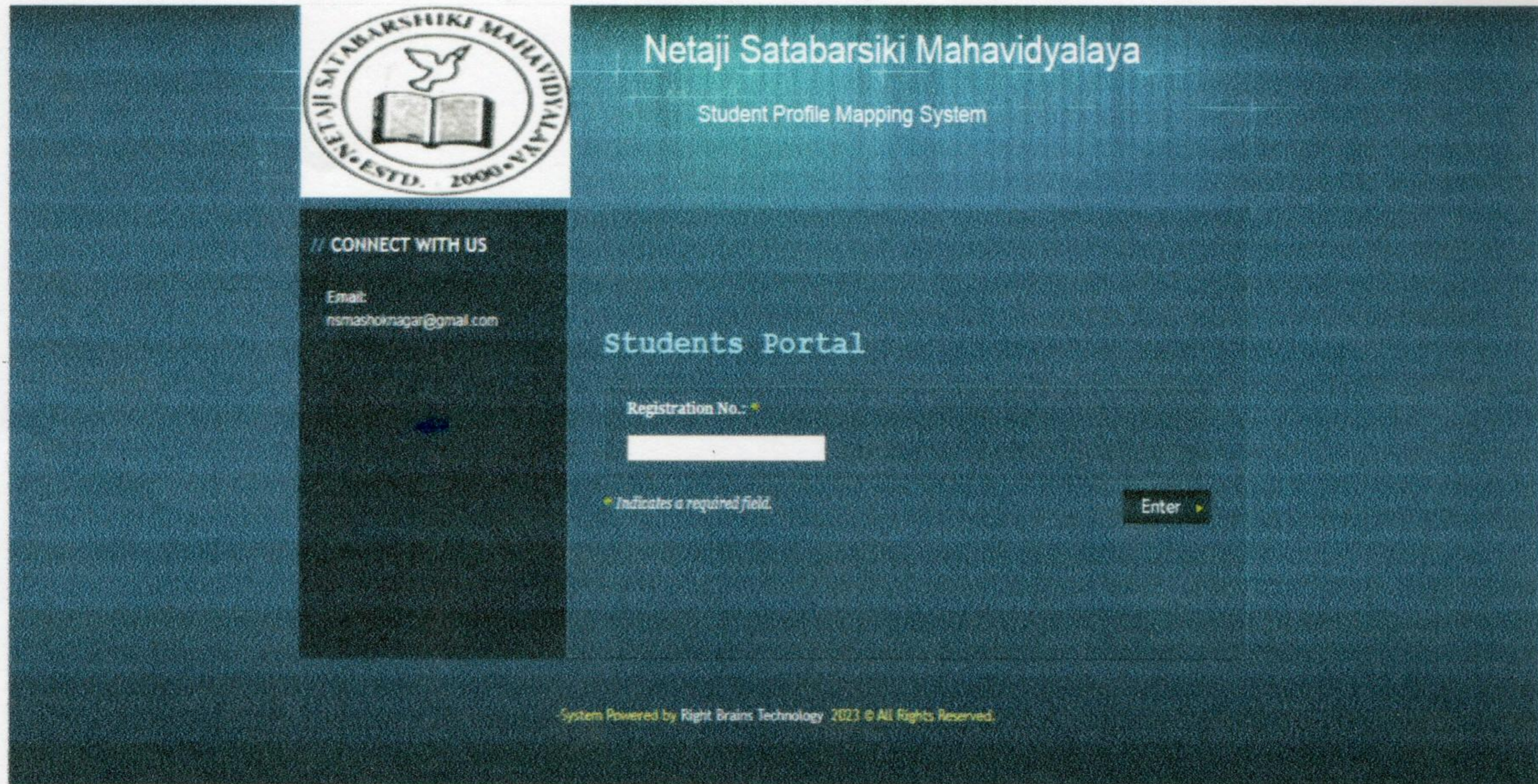
