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ABOUT THE COLLEGE



It is twenty-five years since our Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Mahavidyalaya began its humble journey and indeed in all these years it has carefully built brick by brick an edifice of education and has been nurturing students with purpose and passion and paving the path for opportunities and success. Starting as an affiliated college under the University of Calcutta in 2000, the affiliation of the college was switched to West Bengal State University at Barasat since 2008 like all the other 57 colleges of the district. Now, the college has a three-storied building comprising of 20 classrooms (with Wi-Fi facilities) at present and four specific rooms/computer labs have been allotted to the departments of Geography, Music, Journalism & Mass Communication and Physical Education.

Besides, the college has one seminar room and three class rooms with ICT facilities. The fully automated college library with its spacious reading room provides the students a wide array of books and materials that facilitate the learning process coupled with internet connectivity. It has an air-conditioned stack room for better upkeep of books and periodicals. Presently, the student strength of the college is around fifteen hundred. The teaching- learning-evaluation infrastructure and ambience of the college are conducive to academic upliftment. It has struck an exemplary chord among the neighboring schools and colleges. The results of university examinations over the years speak of our achievement despite having a serious shortage of funds, manpower, and infrastructure. Over the years, the reputation of the college has spread far and wide and it has consistently attracted students from distant areas and diverse strata of society who routinely vie for admission each year to become a part of this august institution.

Presently, the college offers a 4-year major course in ten subjects in B.A. and B.Sc.: Bengali, Education, English, Geography, History, Journalism and Mass Communication, Music, Political Science, Sanskrit, Sociology.

There are thirteen (13) Minor subjects available in B.A. and B.Sc: Bengali, Economics, Education, English, Geography, History, Journalism and Mass Communication, Mathematics, Music, Physical Education, Political Science, Sanskrit, Sociology. A computer course (as a MDC Course) has been initiated under the supervision of NIELIT at a reasonable cost.

The college has a decent Student's council building along with a boys' and a girls' common room within the campus. The college canteen provides a variety of food items at a reasonable price to the staff and students. The motto of the college has unflinchingly remained to impart the best with the least means. The college has been accorded 2(f) and 12B status by the UGC.

There is no denying that the college is heading for excellence. It has a Minority Cell, Career Counseling Cell, Research Committee, RTI Section and Internal Complaints Committee. The NSS Unit of the college is working sincerely and reaching out to the neighbouring community of people. The college is linked with the Students' Health Home that caters to the medical needs of the students. As a part of the Social Outreach Programme various beneficial activities have been carried out at Wards no. 6,9, 17, and 22 of Ashoknagar Kalyangarh Municipality by our college.

Since the institution's inception, the students of the college have made their mark in the fields of games and sports. Their achievements are lauded with trophies and awards in various fields and they have successfully participated and contributed to national events representing the university. The students from the Department of Music have also made tremendous achievements by participating in various college and university level competitions. Students from this department have also become university toppers.

The college library is steadily being upgraded on all fronts with infrastructural developments - books, journals, magazines, and e-resources. Presently the number of books in the college library stands at around 12,600 along with institutional subscriptions to 3 hard copy leading journals and many more online journals. The library provides computer facilities along with reading room facilities to staff and students. Apart from the central library there are departmental libraries of the Major subjects which cater to the specific needs of the faculties and students of the respective subjects.

The college Governing Body was formed in 2008 and has been providing adequate guidance in the functioning of the college. The Students' Council is also quite cooperative and lends effective support in conducting all academic and administrative matters concerning students.

Since the 2014-15 academic session, the college has adopted online admission system prior to the Higher Education notification of 2015-16 which has enormously saved time and provided opportunity to avoid hazards of the otherwise cumbersome process.

The college received a donation of Rs.10,000/-from the eldest son of late Dr. Sadhan Sen to allot-award/prizes to two best students of the final year—one from Core and the other from General course. The annual award ceremony is organised in the month of January every year to celebrate the achievements of our students. In this ceremony all subject toppers are also awarded.

On a positive note, the future of the college holds the promise of excellence by moving ahead with the prospect of introducing new courses, both in B.A. and B.Sc. The 4 Year Major UG programme and 3 year Multidisciplinary UG programme under NEP have rolled out from the 2023-24 session to facilitate greater flexibility in the choice of subjects, the college can offer to the enrolled students. We look forward to marching towards academic excellence in coming days. For this to happen all concerned – students, staff, faculty and management– will have to work hard in a disciplined manner.





VISION

Since the beginning, the mission of the college has been to inculcate collegiate (degree level) education among the economically challenged and minority community students of neighbouring areas from where students throng to get admitted into this college. This vision demands the introduction of modern subjects, job-oriented courses commensurate with the needs of the day and the conventional subjects of study. 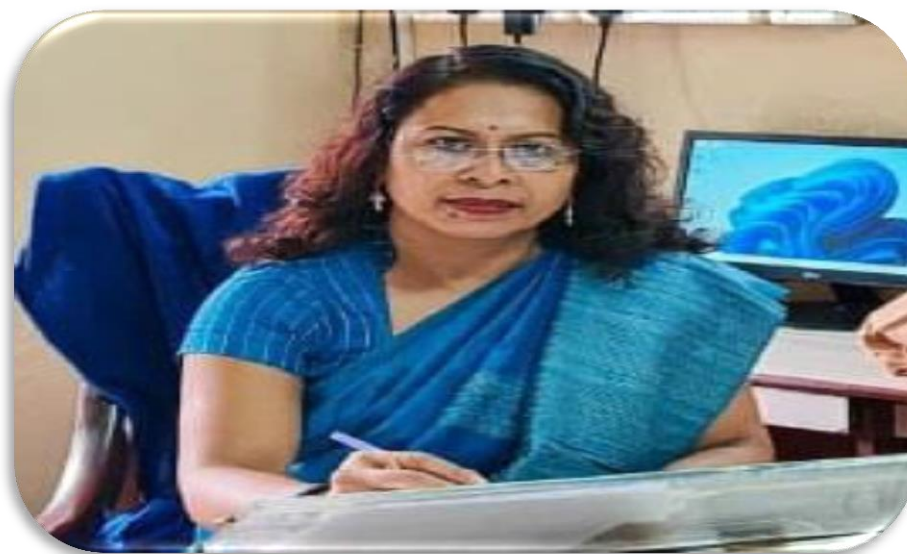
MISSION

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Economics at Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya started its journey in 2014 with a single faculty member, **Shampa Ghosh**. In 2016, **Susmita Bhattacharjee** joined the department. At present, the department has two faculty members. After the CBCS curriculum, the NEP system has been implemented. Students enrolled in Geography Honours undertake Economics as a minor subject. Additionally, Pure Pass students can opt for **Economics, Geography, Mathematics** combination and **Economics, Geography, Education** combination leading to a B.Sc. degree. Under the NEP System, the college offers Economics as **MDC** and **SEC** subject. The department organises syllabus-oriented educational tours to promote experiential learning. In addition to regular academic activities, add-on courses are conducted to enhance students' knowledge and skills.

DEPARTMENTAL UNIQUENESS

The Department of Economics promotes experiential learning by integrating theoretical knowledge with field-based studies. A distinctive feature of the department is its focus on local area– based research and community linkage. The recent study on **Jewellery Box Manufacturing** in Ashoknagar highlights the department's engagement with a local cottage industry. Active students' participation under faculty guidance and the offering of Economics as MDC and SEC courses under the NEP curriculum further strengthen interdisciplinary learning and academic engagement.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Education is dedicated to the academic study of education as a dynamic and multidisciplinary discipline that plays a vital role in individual development and social transformation. The Department of Education was established in 2005, and the Honours course was introduced in 2016. At present, the department offers two programmes under the WBSU NEP structure: the Four-Year B.A. Honours Programme in Education and the Three-Year Multidisciplinary Programme with Education as a combination subject. The undergraduate programme in Education is designed with an interdisciplinary perspective, integrating insights from Educational Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology of Education, Educational Management, Research, Statistics, Guidance and Counselling, Special Education, Educational Technology and Contemporary Educational issues. The programme aims to develop students' understanding of educational theory and practice while encouraging critical thinking, social awareness, and analytical skills. Through this interdisciplinary approach, the department strives to promote holistic development and social responsibility among learners.

DEPARTMENTAL UNIQUENESS

The department adopts diverse and interactive teaching methods such as class discussions, group presentations, seminars, project work, and report writing to enhance students' interest and active participation in learning. The department also emphasizes experiential and community-based learning. Students are encouraged to undertake local area-based educational surveys and small research activities to understand grassroots educational issues. Educational visits and study tours are organized to provide practical exposure. In addition, the department regularly arranges seminars, workshops, special lectures, Publication of e- magazine / wall magazine and various competitions like Poster making, Slogan Writing, Extempore for academic enrichment. Faculty members guide students regarding higher studies and career opportunities in fields such as teacher education, educational research, guidance and counselling and other allied areas of education.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT





The Department of English was established in 2001 and Honours course was introduced in 2003. Currently the department offers two Programmes under the WBSU NEP structure of 4 Year B.A Major in English and 3 Year Multidisciplinary Programme with English as a combination subject. The undergraduate programme in this subject mainly focuses on classical literature though after the emergence of postcolonial theory, the literary programme has started to reconsider Eurocentric literature and knowledge, adding emphasis on literatures from India and Global South. Apart from that this programme offers a site of critical enquiry, provides students scope for research and helps them explore the diverse fields of interdisciplinary projects.

DEPARTMENTAL UNIQUENESS

The Department of English at Netaji Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya has been contributing consistently to the academic and cultural life of the students. The Department is oriented to strike a balance between traditional and contemporary thrust areas of English studies. As part of Indian Knowledge Systems, the curriculum includes courses on Indian Classical literature, Indian writings in English and in English translations, Dalit literature and Literature from Northeast India. The department also promotes discourses on gender issues through curricular inclusion of courses on women's writings, queer writings, etc. Another contemporary thrust area for the department is ecocriticism and theoretical discussions relating to the anthropocene. The academic activities of the department include seminars and special invited lectures to take our students closer to emerging areas of research. Again, study tours are undertaken to connect theoretical curriculum to real-world scenarios through visits to museums, churches, art-galleries and historical sites. This experiential mode of learning beyond the classroom fosters better relationships among peers and teachers, while providing opportunities to meet new people. The Department attempts to engage with questions of socially inclusive teaching at a semi-urban locality. As majority of our students comes from socio-economically poor background, the faculty's approach to teaching, thus, remains strongly learner-centric to accommodate these students' distinct needs

This has led to consistently good results of our students some of whom, then, pursued higher studies in core and allied disciplines. It is at the intersection of these varied academic imperatives and by initiating arguments and debating ideas in literary arts and popular culture, the English department at NSM has found its unique calling.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Geography was established in 2001 and Honours course was introduced in 2006. Currently the department offers two Programmes under the WBSU NEP structure 4 Years.

B.Sc Major in Geography and 3 Year Multidisciplinary Programme with Geography as a combination subject. The Undergraduate Program in Geography is founded on the growing importance of interdisciplinary approaches in understanding complex environmental and societal issues. The program integrates the perspectives and analytical tools of Physical Geography, Human Geography, Environmental Science, and Geospatial Science. It emphasizes hands-on learning through fieldwork, spatial data analysis, and modern geospatial technologies, enabling students to critically examine human–environment interactions, spatial patterns, and sustainable development challenges. The program also encourages research- oriented learning, equipping students with practical and analytical skills relevant to academic, professional, and policy-making domains

DEPARTMENTAL UNIQUENESS

The Department adopts diverse and innovative teaching methods such as class debates and dialogues, group discussions, presentations, and report writing to enhance interest of students and active engagement in the subject. We strongly emphasize field-based and community-oriented learning; therefore, regular field excursions and study tours are conducted to geographically significant areas such as river basins, urban centers, rural settlements, and environmentally sensitive regions. Students are also encouraged to undertake field surveys, socio-economic studies, and environmental assessments within local communities to promote experiential learning alongside classroom teaching. The department is also equipped with a well-developed computer laboratory with modern facilities, enabling students to gain practical training in Geographical Information Systems, Remote Sensing, and spatial data analysis. Relevant and insightful workshops, seminars, and special lectures are organized to enrich their academic exposure. The faculty members further guide students regarding higher studies and career opportunities in allied fields such as Urban Planning, Environmental Management, and other career-oriented pathways.

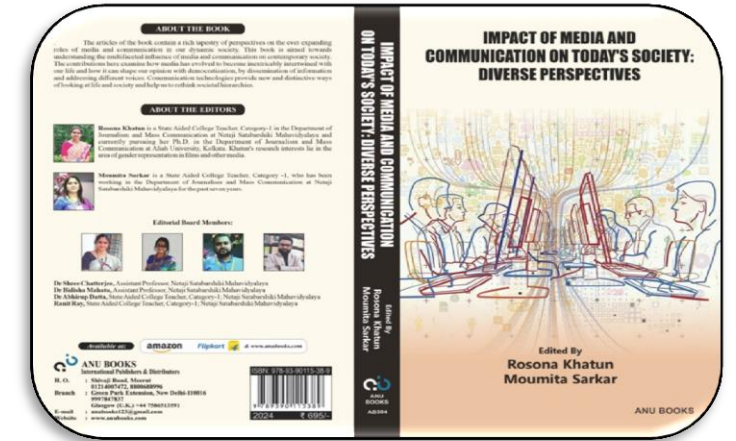
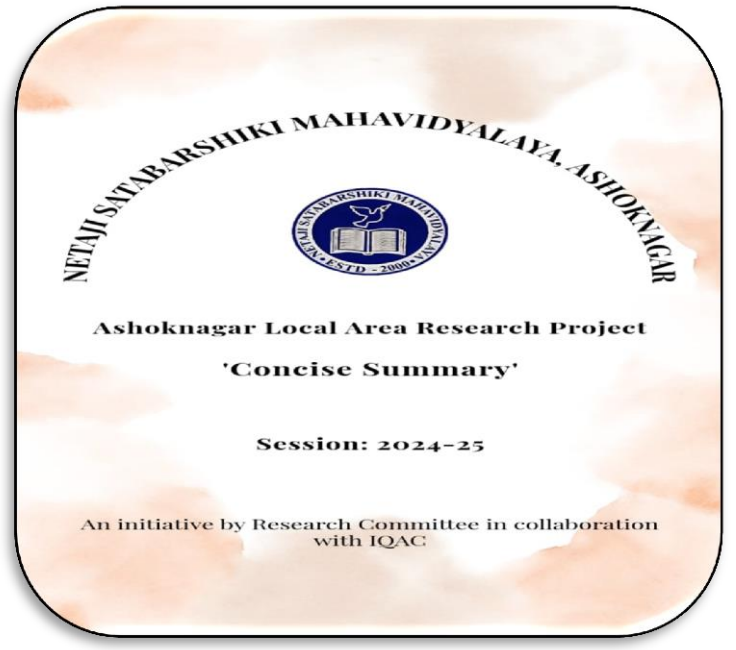
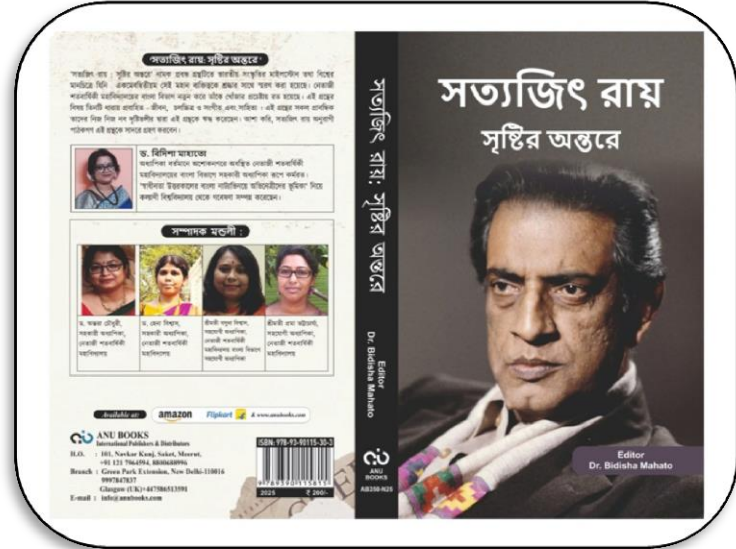


GLIMPSE OF STUDENT ORIENTATION AND STUDENT WEEK PROGRAMME .



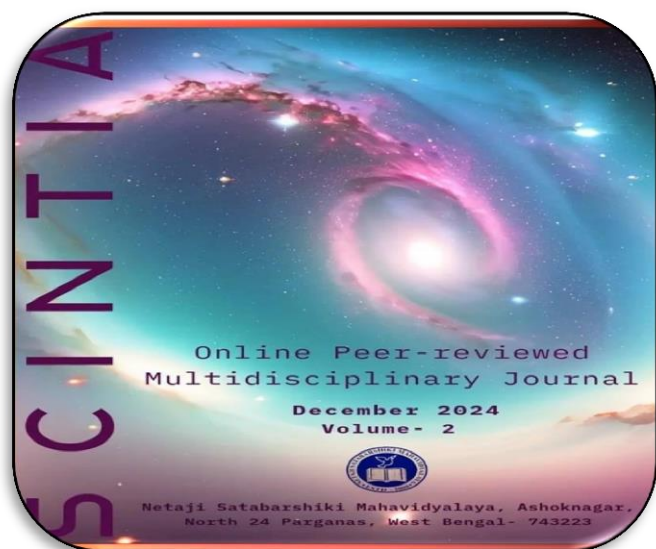

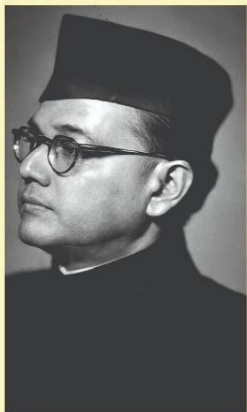

MENTORING

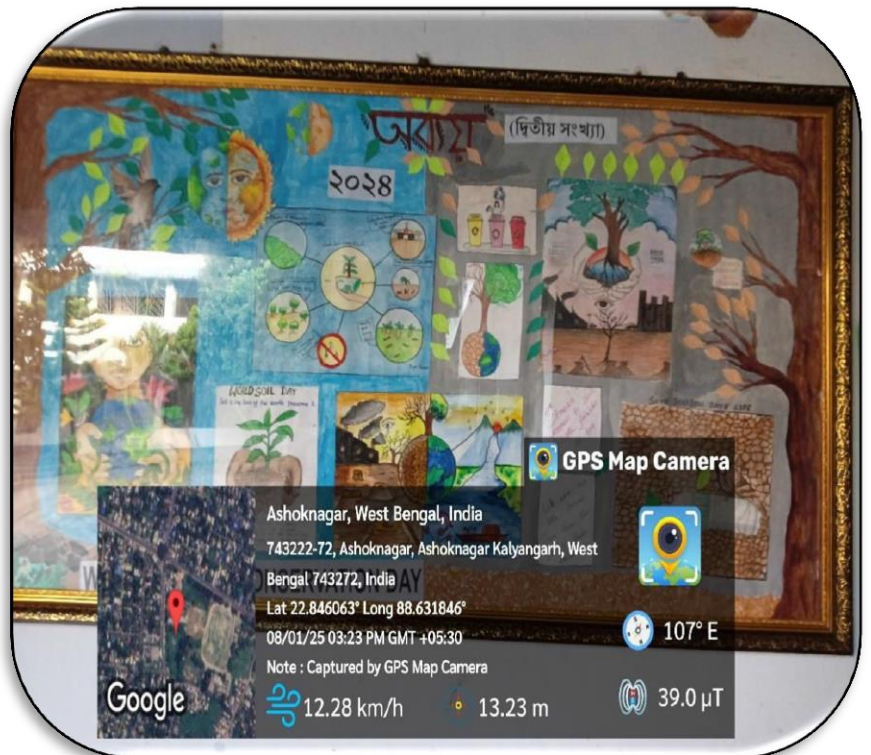


GREEN COMMITTEE

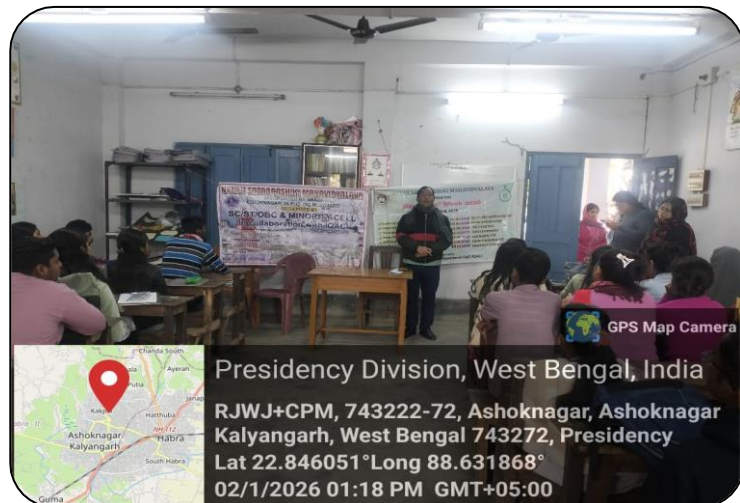

FACILITATING SCHOLARSHIP

The college office provides application forms for “Kanyashree Prakalpa” (a conditional cash transfer scheme under the Department of Women Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal), which is aimed at improving the status and well-being of girl children in West Bengal by incentivizing the schooling of teenage girls.
